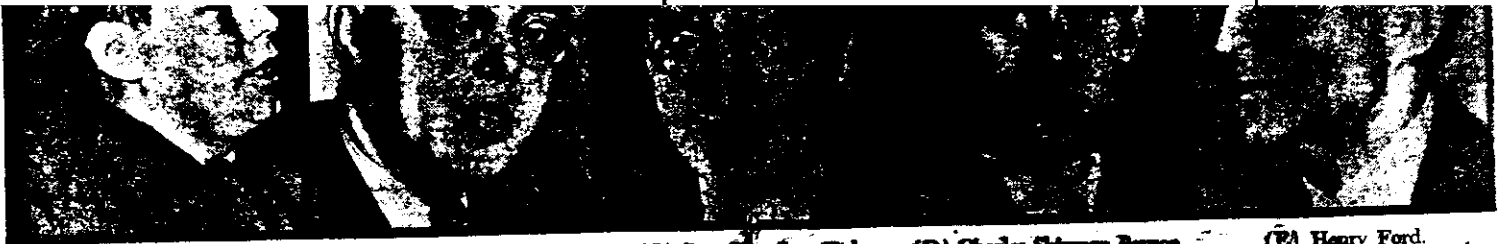

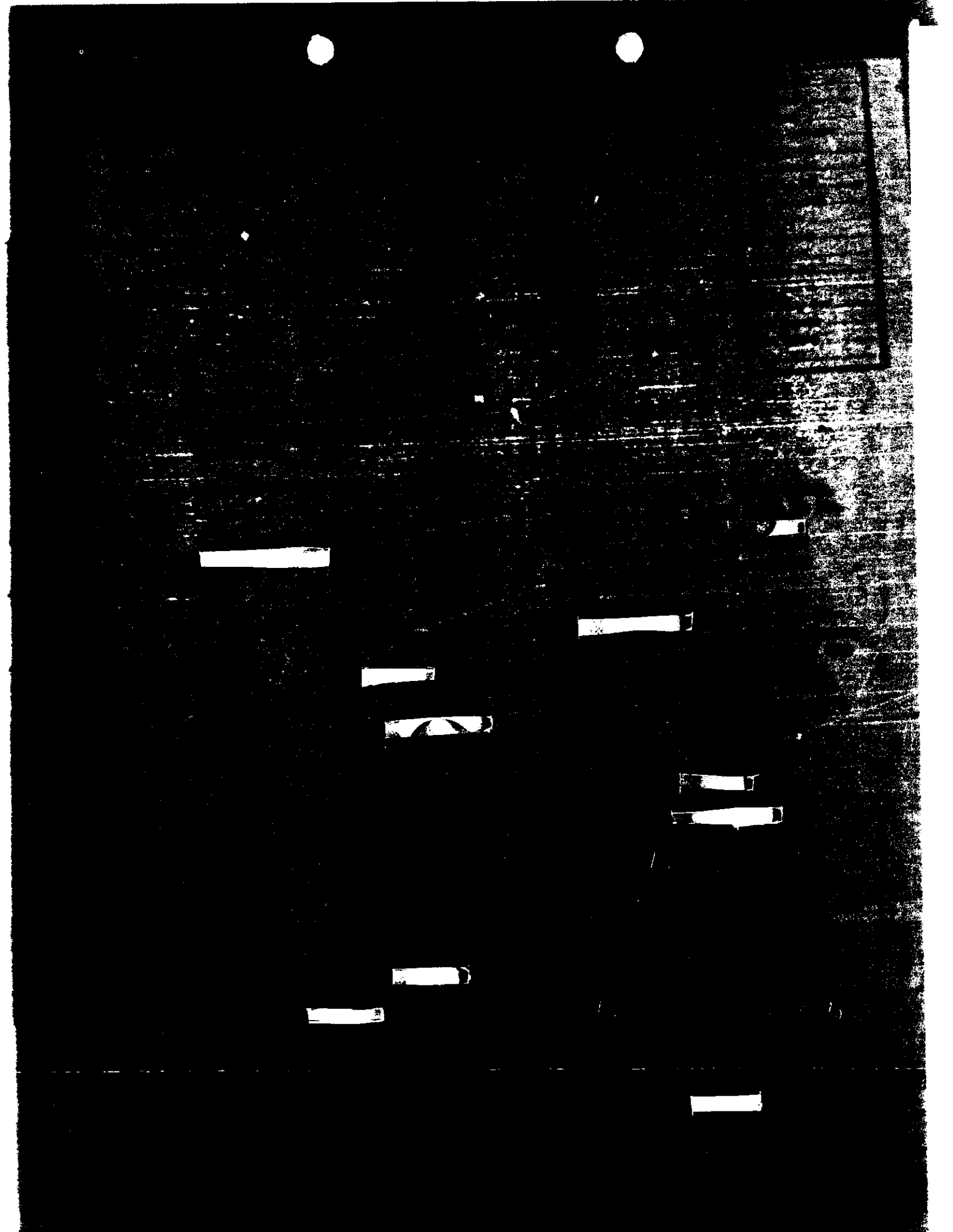

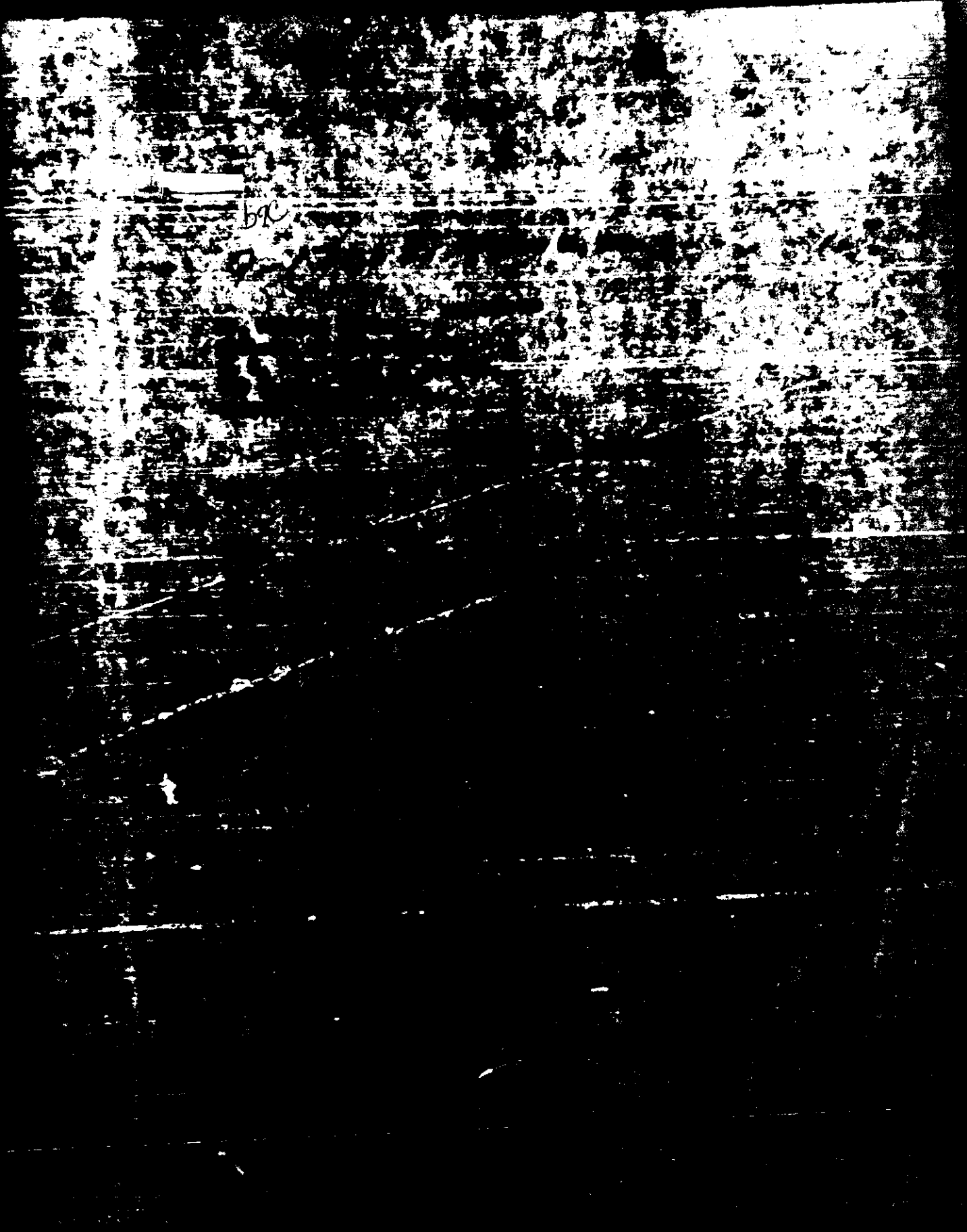

on July 4, 1938, [redacted] with officer [redacted] had
picked up an individual at 511st and Harvard Streets in Seattle upon co-
plaint of a woman who had advised the officers that subject had complain's
about food that had been given [redacted] in a restaurant for which he had made
no payment. [redacted] further stated that this case had been as-
signed to Detective [redacted] and that after subject had
been arrested certain letters were found on his person, together with
Postoffice receipts indicating that he had been writing threatening let-
ters to [redacted] HENRY FORD and [redacted] b7C

Agents ascertained from [redacted] that at the time sub-
ject was arrested he had given his name as [redacted] claimed to be
unemployed, and stated that he resided at the Livingstone Hotel, 1931
1st Avenue, Seattle, Washington. [redacted] further stated that
subject, when searched, had in his possession a stamped typewritten letter
signed by FREDERICK JAMES WELSH and addressed to HENRY FORD, Dearborn,
Michigan, dated June 9, 1938, threatening Mr. FORD with kidnaping and
bodily harm in the event he failed to send \$50,000.00 to the said FRED-
ERICK JAMES WELSH. [redacted] indicated that [redacted] appear
to be a mental case and had complained in a restaurant where he was beg-
ging because the restaurant operator had failed to furnish him dessert b7C

[redacted] was brought into the Detective's Office, where
was interviewed by Agents. Subject admitted having in his possession
letter dated June 9, 1938, R. G. Box 128, Kansas City, Missouri, ad-
dressed to Mr. HENRY FORD, Dearborn, Michigan, and written with a typewriter
reading \$50,000.00. On this line [redacted] disclaimed his author-
ship of this letter, stating that he had found the same while walking on
of Seattle. Various postoffice receipts found by police officers in
possession of subject had in the last thereof, in typewritten let-
ters of HENRY FORD, [redacted] b7C
[redacted] stated that these receipts represented threatening letters sent
the victims in this case. He further disclaimed having written
letters in which he attempted to obtain money under threat of b7C

It was apparent to Agents that subject is mentally
such as his conversation constantly reverted to religious

of philanthropy. He admitted that such men as the named victims
could had been the subjects of letters written by him in which he
demanded of large sums of money. [redacted] advised that he has
traveled over the country, stopping in cheap hotels and rooming houses
offices, both on the East and on the West Coast. He claimed to be
troubled by neuropathic and admitted ownership of a small portable
typewriter which was found by police officers in his room at the
Luna Hotel. [redacted] admitted using this typewriter for the purpose
writing letters to men of responsibility in all walks of life requesting
financial assistance. b7C

postmasters in Seattle and Spokane for letters mailed by him to victims

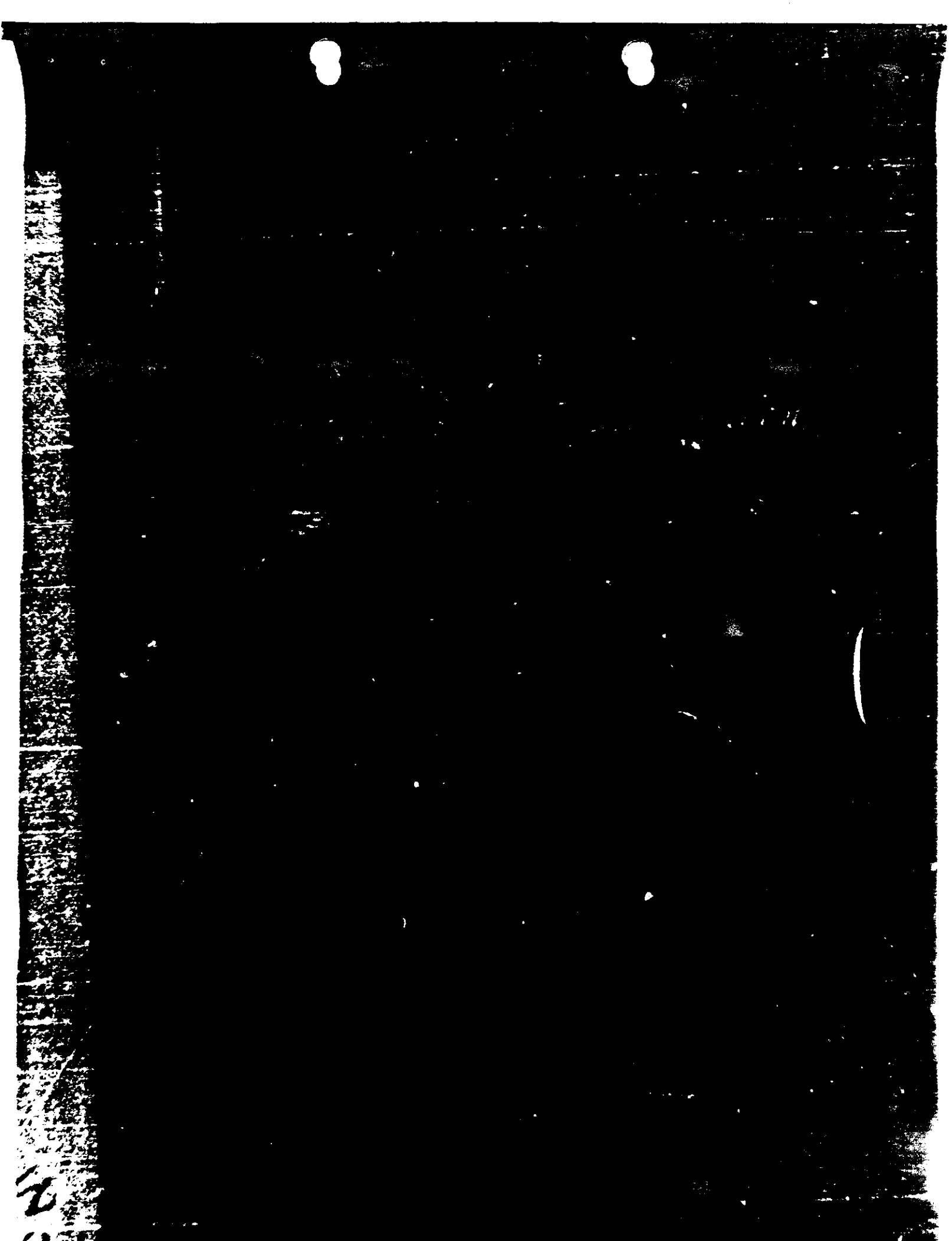

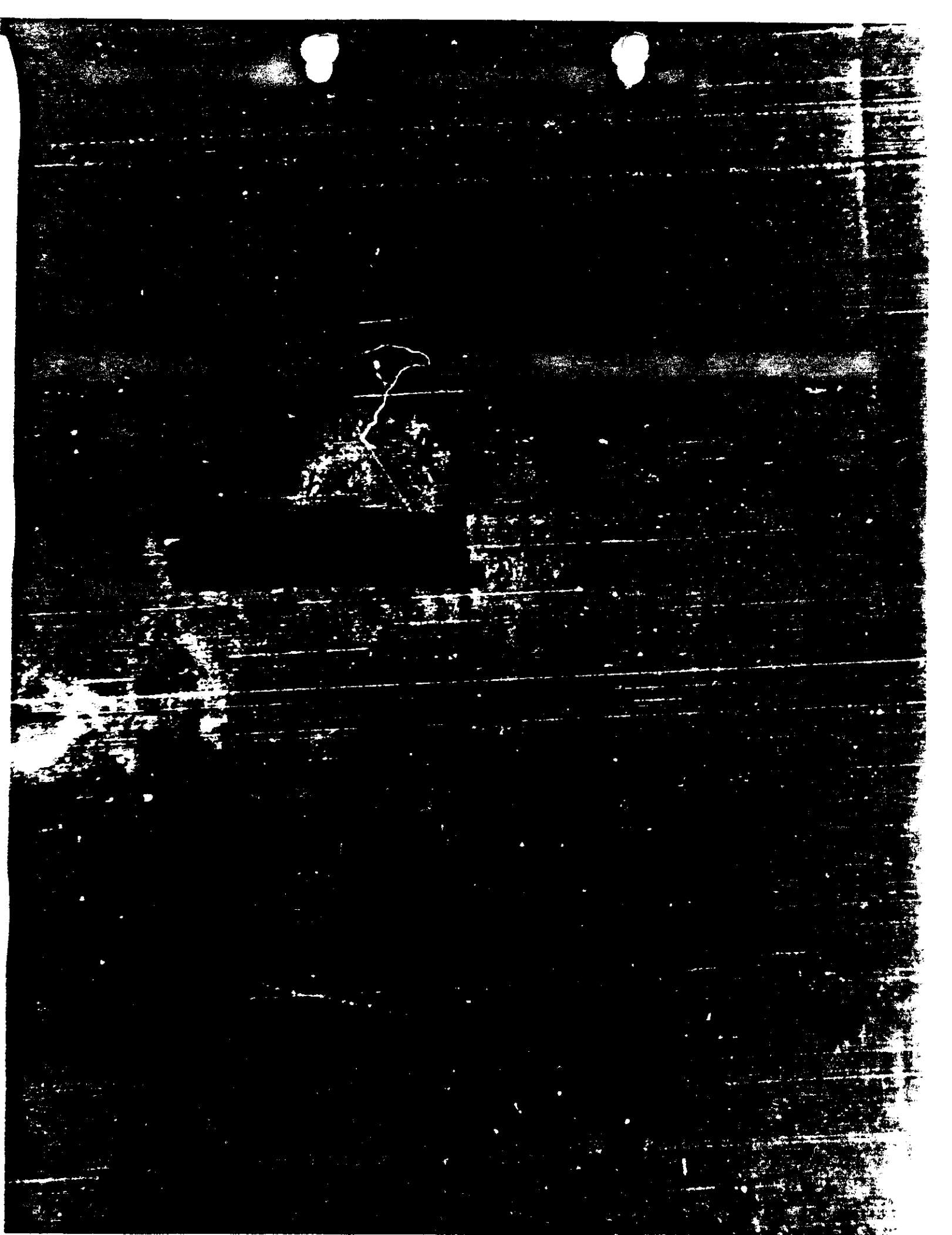

If you don't start something in the line of work, there is a lot of people that are going to find it pretty hard to get along. I was refused at your plant at one time because my eyes are pretty bad. 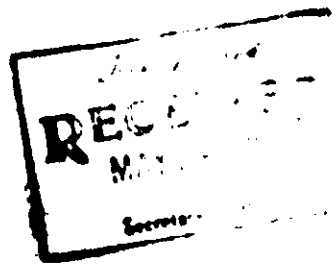

██████████ Denver Branch, Ford Motor Company, Denver, Colorado, advised this office that they had been instructed by letter from Mr. J. S. WIGGAS of the Ford Motor Company in Detroit, Michigan, to turn over certain photostatic copies and one original of letter, mailed from a period of March 24, 1941 to January 10, 1944 to the Ford Motor Company, Dearborn, Michigan, attention Mr. HENRY FORD. b7c

██████████ advised that from April 5, 1938 to January 7, 1939 ██████████ the apparent writer of these letters, had a Ford Motor Agency at ██████████ Colorado. He terminated his agency because he was financially unable to continue business. These men stated that there were no financial transactions directly with the Ford Motor Company, but that, as they understood it, some of the cars held by ██████████ had been repossessed by the General Credit Corporation Company. b7c

These men stated that according to the letter from Mr. WIGGAS there was a direct violation of the Federal Extortion Statutes contained in these letters and, therefore, this matter should be brought to the attention of the Denver Field Office of this Bureau for appropriate action.

██████████ copies of which are being forwarded to the Denver Field Divisions, indicates ██████████ Ford Motor Company owes him some amount of money. These matters were immediately brought to the attention of Mr. J. HARRISCHY, U.S. State Attorney, Colorado, who advised that he would decline prosecution inasmuch as they did not appear to be sufficient to establish a violation of the Extortion Statute, and further that from the tone of the letters, ██████████ appeared to be mentally unbalanced. Yesterday morning Federal Judge [Redacted] is a visiting judge sitting in this district as judge in the Civil Suit of Sapiro vs. Ford, called me into conference with him in his chambers and advised me that certain incidents had happened in connection with the present trial and certain reports had been made to him and he personally requested that I make an investigation. The occurrences and incidents are as outlined herewith:

This trial has naturally attracted a great deal of attention. The corridors of this building about the court room are jammed and crowded every day with thousands of persons, the greater percentage of whom are sightseers. The report has been frequently circulated about the building that Mr. Ford was to appear as a witness on various and sundry occasions. However, he has not appeared as a witness to date. On March the 29th, 1927, Mr. [Redacted] a Deputy United States Marshal and two of his friends by the names of [Redacted] were out to lunch together during the noon recess. [Redacted] Lechnoor [Redacted] Lechnoor [Redacted] village being a suburb of Detroit. These men [Redacted] old friends of the Deputy Marshal, and they went out [Redacted] at the Mike Sangle at 11:45 A. M. It so appears that [Redacted] bears a striking resemblance to Henry Ford. These three gentlemen returned to the building at 1:40 P. M. Court was not in session, but the usual crowd was hanging around the corridors and the court door, attempting to gain admission. [Redacted] asked the Deputy if there was any way that he might get into the court room as he was very desirous of seeing Senator Reed in action as an Attorney. [Redacted] said they b7c

could view at the doorway and see if there was a chance for
to get in. Another Deputy Marshal by the name

this trial. When the three above mentioned men came to the
door of the courtroom, they stopped and [redacted] the Deputy

Mr. Ford, and attempted to show him great courtesy, pushed him
into the courtroom and provided him a seat which would be
directly back of Senator Reed and at the council table. Mr.

state that I have not instituted an investigation of this matter,

Concerning the Deputy Marshal [redacted] for your
confidential information, I beg to advise you that he is one
of the best men I have ever known and a very good starting with
the United States Marshal Service. [redacted] is an extremely
efficient man and has never been reprimanded in the Federal Building and
his manner in handling things and his treatment of various
individuals. As a Deputy Marshal, three prisoners have escaped
from him, one of whom has never since been captured. b7c

From all I know of this occasion and everything
that transpired in connection with it, [redacted] brought upon himself
and does not appear to be any justification of any character to
show that any person was attempting to make the Federal Court or

This deponent was unable to hear the conversation sufficiently well to understand the same; and it continued until Deputy United States Marshal George Reamer approached said Miller and the said Mrs. Hoffman, when they separated.

Deponent together with A. G. Gandler followed said Miller to the Lafayette Building where Miller went up in the elevator accompanied by Gandler while deponent remained in the hallway. In about five or ten minutes Miller came down alone and deponent followed him to the Majestic Building which Miller entered at the Woodward Avenue entrance and took an elevator in the battery of elevators located in the middle of the building and accompanied by deponent went to the eighth floor where both left the car. Miller then went to the battery of elevators located on the westerly side of the building and took a car going up, while deponent went down and remained in the hallway where he again met Miller when the latter left the car in about two or three minutes. Deponent then left the Majestic Building in the neighborhood of the Woodward Avenue entrance to the J. L. Hudson Store following the said Miller where the said Miller waited beside a standing limousine until all the people were assembled and then he quickly entered and left the limousine.

Deponent states that from March 21, 1937, to April 19, 1937, he was in the course of his duties in daily attendance at the post Office Building in the city of Detroit at the trial of the cases of Aaron Sapiro versus Henry Ford and the Dearborn Publishing Company, defendants.

Deponent states that on Tuesday, March 22, 1937, he observed Mrs. Vera Hoffmann, a member of the jury impaneled in said cause, and on two occasions to three men who were of Jewish caste of countenance, the first of said conversations taking place about 11 A. M. during a recess period and the second about 12:30 P. M. when the noon recess was taken; one of these men, whose name at that time was not known to deponent but whom deponent is informed and believes is known as "Kid" Miller, was a man appearing to be from 45 to 50 years of age, about 5 feet 7 inches tall, weighing in the neighborhood of 150 pounds, was bald headed, and was wearing a dark grey overcoat and a dark green hat. On this occasion deponent pointed out this man and called him to the attention of Carl Brooks, John Mueller, Joseph Deemer and Joseph Glendon, who were working under the supervision of deponent.

On Wednesday, March 23, 1937, deponent, in company with said Mueller, saw these same three men whom deponent is believing about the corridors of the third floor of the post Office Building in the vicinity of the court room, said corridors being used from 10 A. M. until 12:30 P. M. when court adjourned for the day. At the corner of said, in the corridor adjacent to the court room, the said "Kid" Miller approached the said Carl Hoffmann, lifted his hat, spoke to her by name and shook hands with her; they then began to hold a conversation and the said Miller requested the said Carl Hoffmann to go to lunch with him.
