[REDACTED] furnished information concerning a conversation between Stanley Levison and Clarence Jones the night of 4/24/64 relating to Martin Luther King's press release of 4/23/64 attacking the Director's budget testimony on communist influence in racial matters. The conversation was in extremely guarded language as a result of which our analysis of its true meaning must necessarily be very speculative. We are able to make these speculations only because of our prior knowledge of what the King camp intended doing. My memoranda to you 4/21, 23, 24/64 informed of advice given to King by Levison and Jones that King must not remain silent after the 4/15/64 Joseph Alsop article expressing King's communist connections. King instructed an associate, Walter Fauntroy, to see Burke Marshall on 4/22/64 concerning the matter. Then, after the 4/21/64 release of the Director's budget testimony, the King camp decided on a public response by King in the form of a press release which would attack both the Director's testimony and the Alsop article.

The Levison-Jones conversation 4/24/64 contained the following: Jones said that King's release on both the article and Hoover's statement is being widely publicized in Californian newspapers. Levison commented that Hoover did not directly relate to the article. Jones said, "No, but statement was a broad statement." (Apparently relating to King's release). Levison asked if statement was a disavowal of connections (apparent reference to King's communist connections). Jones said, "Yes... and placing the issue within the context of the movement, particularly as relates to unsolved bombings, etc." (It is noted that King's release ends with a criticism of the Bureau's alleged failures in bombing investigations). Levison and Jones agreed that King's release was a real head-on attack.

Levison asked if King had talked to anybody and Jones answered, "Through a representative." (This could well refer to Fauntroy acting for King). Levison asked the result and Jones replied, "That discussion felt it was important to make a statement... just as we had indicated

earlier, that the failure to do anything was devastating." Levison asked if any hostility was encountered and Jones said, "No." (Apparently meaning that Marshall was friendly to Fauntroy if such contact actually took place). Levison next noted that the "Aloop" article indicated that the Administration is disappointed in King and Levison inquired, "What is the Administration from which the disappointment emanates?" Jones replied, "After an explanation was given for the reasons for the limited contact during the transition period, it was apparently accepted in good faith." (This expression by Jones dovetails with our earlier information that Fauntroy was to tell Marshall that there had been some limited King-Levison contacts but only relating to a transition period of the New York office of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference).

Levison asked concerning the contact made by a King emissary, "Was it a high enough level to feel that both the acceptance of the Fauntroy explanation and the recommendation that he say something?" Jones replied, "At previous levels," to which Levison said, "This sounds good... I'm glad," and that now they were not in the position of being guilty by silence.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is obvious that the above-reported conversation is extremely guarded to the point of being unclear to an outsider. However, we can speculate that Jones and Levison are referring either to some person high in the Administration not known to us at this moment or to Burke Marshall who is known to us as being involved in the King matter. Whoever it was apparently agreed with the idea of King's press release. We will remain particularly alert through our sources covering the key individuals for any information which will positively establish the identity of the person to whom Jones and Levison alluded.

On 4/15/64, the "New York Herald Tribune", a New York City daily newspaper, page 28, carried a column attributed to JOSEPH ALSOP. In it, ALSOP reports that despite the American Communist Party's feebleness and disarray, its agents are beginning to infiltrate certain sectors of the Negro civil rights movement".

ALSOP notes that the subject of the real-head shaking in Washington is MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. He (King) has accepted and is almost certainly still accepting Communist collaboration and even Communist advice, ALSOP notes.

Continuing, ALSOP reported that in 1962-1963, the issue of the Communists' role in the KING organization was raised because of HUNTER PITTS O'DELL, who he said had held posts in KING'S organization; however, O'DELL was finally dropped when KING was warned by the United States Government officials he was the "genuine Communist article".

The conference, according to the source, concerned Adele Kanter (employee of New York Southern Christian Leadership Conference) among other things. In that regard, Levison told Jones that he did not know that he had seen Adele Kanter and instructed her to talk to him (Levison). Levison said he invited Kanter to dinner, at which time he learned what Jones had said to her.

if she felt it necessary to talk to Stanley (Levison) and that he, Jones, would make the final decision.

According to the first source, Levison told Jones there was a "certain sort of moneyness (ph) about what to do in connection with some questions that will come up, as it is a complex operation." Levison said he had a suggestion he thought would solve it since it "can't be solved in the old way." He told Jones that his friend (Jones') Saul Mills, was the "guy" to meet her. Levison indicated that the purpose of the contact was to set up a relationship with Mills so that Adele Kanter could call on him. He said all that she needed was "somebody to lean on who has some judgment in these areas, with an expert background of it so she can call easily and discuss lists, et cetera."

Jones said he was planning to have lunch with Mills on Wednesday, (April 27, 1964) and, therefore, could invite Kanter. Levison urged Jones to invite her so that she would not become discouraged and founder.

In conclusion, Jones said they (Atlanta Southern Christian Leadership Conference) are pleased with Kanter and added that Levison's suggestion was very good.

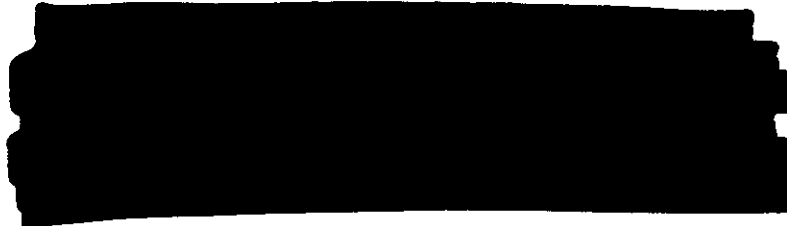

On May 28, 1956, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that she knew Saul Mills as a member of the Communist Party all through the period 1938 - 1947. The source stated that Mills had been one of the most important persons in the CP and could be considered on the level with William Z. Foster (who was Chairman of the CP, USA during this period). The source further advised that she attended literally hundreds of meetings of the CP at which Saul Mills was present, as well as hundreds of trade union meetings run by the Communist Party. In respect to Saul Mill's knowledge of the CP nature of these meetings, the source stated that there is no question but that Mills was cognizant at the time they were official meetings of the CP. The source stated that she observed Saul Mills in 1944 at a meeting called by the National Committee of the Communist Party and observed him at a meeting of top functionaries of the CP held following the 1944 convention, at which time Mills delivered a speech. X

On May 25, 1956, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that in the late 1930s and early 1940s, Saul Mills was looked upon by the CP as being a highly trustworthy person and one whose word could be accepted and acted upon with respect to action the CP might take in regard to discipline cases involving individuals known to Mills.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 27, 1964, that Stanley Levison conferred with Clarence Jones on that date. Levison said he wanted to inform Jones that "our friends" felt that the only way the Mississippi thing (case of the missing civil rights workers) could be solved was through the use of a "stool pigeon". Continuing, Levison said, "we" all know that a "stool pigeon" will not go to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) with information, and that Mississippi Police authorities do not want any information. Levison continued:

Levison said "we" feel that William Higgs, who is now a lawyer in Washington, D.C., is the right person to make this offer as Higgs was a civil rights lawyer in Mississippi before he was forced to leave the state. Levison indicated that Higgs would most likely know a "stool pigeon" who would talk for money.

Levison said "we" felt that it must be someone like Jones who should approach Higgs.

Jones told Levison that he had a better idea, which he related as follows:

"Alfred Bingham, Jonathan Bingham's brother (reform Democratic candidate who defeated Congressman William Buckley in recent Bronx New York primary)" contacted him recently to find out the political leanings of the Council of Federated Organizations (COFO) group of which Jonathan Bingham's daughter is a member, because Jonathan was concerned about her membership becoming a political issue.

Jones related that during his conversation with Alfred Bingham, Bingham mentioned that a close friend of his was a judge in Jackson, Mississippi, and a member of the White Citizens Council in that city. Jones said it might be a good idea to contact him (the Judge) about this idea.

Levison said Jones' plan sounded good to him and that he would let "our friends" know about it right away, but added that Jones must remain in the picture. Jones indicated that the judge in Jackson known to Alfred Bingham was a law school friend of Bingham's.

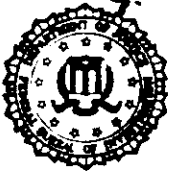

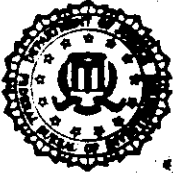

During their contact, KANTER related the results of a recent conversation she had with STANLEY (LEVISON). She told of instructions received from LEVISON which she was to relate to JONES.

On November 24, 1964, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished information which reflected that Martin Luther King, Jr. (President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference) (SCLC) was in contact with Clarence Jones on that date. King advised that he was in the process of writing his speeches which he would deliver in Oslo, Norway (where he will receive the Nobel Peace Prize in December, 1964). He said "they" (officials in Norway) have two speeches which are customarily made by recipients of the prize: the Nobel lecture, 45 minutes in length and given the night following the Nobel Presentation; and a five minute speech at the time of the Presentation. King said he had been working on the forty five minute speech but had done nothing on the five minute speech, therefore, he had in mind asking three people to put on paper what they felt he should say during the five minute speech. He said he was of the opinion that those remarks would be quoted in full and in that regard, told Jones that he wanted him to think (his speech) through with "our friend" the kind of thing that he should say from the platform. King requested that ^{the} speech be sent to his house by Saturday (November 28, 1964). Jones agreed to comply.

King told Jones that he would also ask Andrew Young (assistant to King) and Harry Wachtel to prepare five minute speeches and from those he would decide the best thing to say.

In continuing their contact, King said he would leave Atlanta, Georgia, on Sunday (November 29, 1964), to go to Cincinnati, Ohio, where he would speak; will go to Stamford, Connecticut, on Monday (November 30, 1964); return to Atlanta on that date and remain until Thursday, when he will go to New York.

While in New York, the following affairs will be held in his honor, according to King: a dinner at Dr. Ralph Bunche's home on December 3, 1964; a luncheon on December 4, given by Secretary General U. Thant; and a reception that night given by United Nations Ambassador Adlai Stevenson.

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This reference was a Bureau memo to the Director from A. H. Belmont, dated 8/23/63, captioned "March on Washington 8/28/63" (157-970). The memo stated that although there was no indication that the CP controlled or initiated this march, it was interesting to note that when Martin Luther King, Jr. first conceived the idea of a march, he consulted Stanley David Levison and sought his advice 6/1/63, as to whether the time was right for such a move. Levison agreed "the time is now". King suggested that Levison or Clarence Jones, who was also a participant in this conversation, see A. Philip Randolph and discuss the march with him. The fact that the National Council of Churches had expressed an interest in King's direct action approach was also discussed by King, Levison and Jones.

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During a pretext call to the office of "In Friendship", 122 East 57th St., NYC, on 1/29/59, an unidentified individual advised that Ella Baker was Executive Secretary of "In Friendship".

"The Worker", dated 3/25/56, revealed that "In Friendship" was a new organization formed by representatives of 75 New York churches, unions and fraternal societies to give economic aid to Negroes in the South caught in the vice of economic boycotts.

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[REDACTED] advised that on 8/20/63, Gordon Haskell (100-354951) made inquiries at the office of Stanley Levison regarding the whereabouts of Martin Luther King, indicating that he desired to talk to King. This information was furnished Levison's secretary, Clarence Jones, and Jones indicated that he knew where King was and would contact Haskell regarding this matter.

Levison was in contact with Martin Luther King, Jr. regarding a mass march on Washington which was to be held to help the passage of civil rights legislation. He was in contact with Clarence Jones of the Ghandi Society For Human Rights, an organization formed to support King and his philosophy. Levison was also in contact with Mrs. Lotte Kunstler when they discussed the resignation of Hunter Pitts O'Dell from the SCLC. 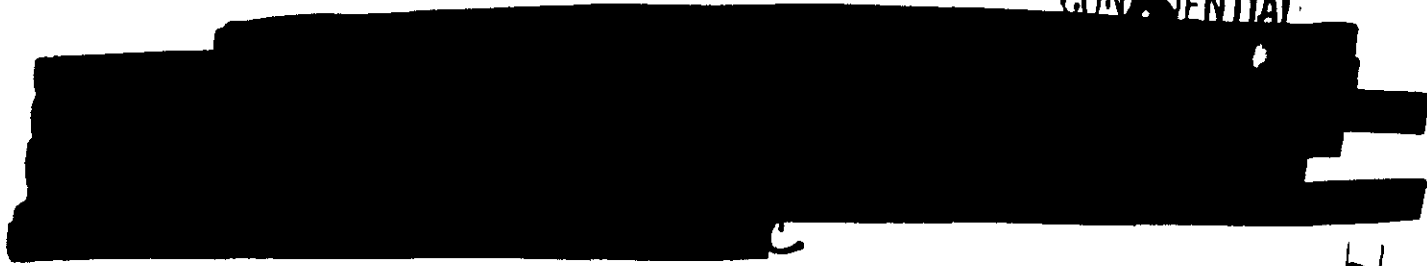

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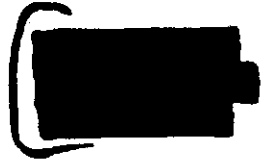
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The following references on Stanley Levison appear in the main file of Martin Luther King, 100-106670. The references set out close association and activities engaged in by the two men in the civil rights movement. Levison was an advisor to King and exerted a strong influence on him. King was warned by the Department of Justice about Levison's CP connections, but King ignored the warning until an article appeared in the syndicated column of Joseph Alsop in April 1964. This article stated that a small amount of CP infiltration existed in the civil rights movement and mentioned an unnamed person that King was still associating with after being warned about him. King took this unnamed person to be Levison and discontinued his open contacts with him, although he continued his contacts through an intermediary. Numerous contacts set out.

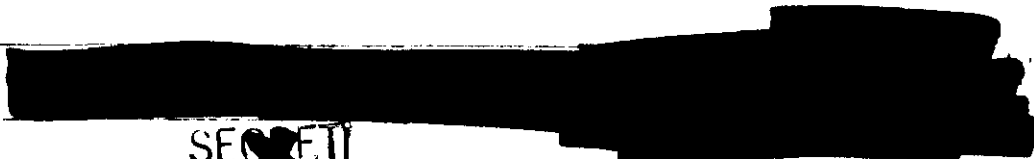

On June 27, 1964, a second confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Stanley Levison conferred with Clarence Jones on the night of June 27, 1964. Jones inquired if Levison had spoken to the Goodman family (the Robert Goodman family, parents of missing civil rights worker). Levison answered negatively, prompting Jones to remark that Reverend Martin Luther King had contacted the Goodman family.

According to the source, Jones and Levison agreed to meet at Levison's apartment at 1:00 p.m., June 28, 1964, to discuss important matters.

On June 28, 1964, the first confidential source advised that Clarence Jones stated on that date that he was going to meet on that date with Mr. and Mrs. Robert Goodman and Mr. and Mrs. Nathan Schwerner (parents of the missing Mississippi civil rights workers).

Jones also stated that he was tentatively going to Mississippi on June 29, 1964, to conduct some affairs for the Attorney representing the parents of the civil rights workers.
