The following information which was taken from the publication "The Hour" was received at the Bureau from an outside unknown source.

Every week Edward James Smythe, who is an anti-Catholic admirer of Father Coughlin and a speaker at the Ku Klux Klan-Bund rally in New Jersey, writes a column for "Publicity", the Fascist newspaper which is published in Wichita, Kansas. The newspaper is edited by one E. J. Garner, but the man behind it is Dr. J. P. Brinkley, of "monkey-gland" notoriety. Mr. Smythe, who has declared der Fuehrer to be the Twentieth Century Messiah, always devotes his column in "Publicity" to bitter labor baiting, violent attacks on the Jewish people and general slander against American democracy.

For the December 19th issue of "Publicity", Smythe wrote -- in addition to his regular contribution -- a front page article. The title of this feature was "Hitler's Money System Is Compared With Ours". The author, after quoting at length from Hitler's "Mein Kampf", makes this statement:

"Now Mr. and Mrs. America -- Just read the above and give it your full consideration, and I want to learn your reaction. --Here is Hitler talking. --Here he places the people before the state, not as the Jews of America are telling you, that he takes away all your liberties -- as a matter of fact he is here taking you, and you, and you out of economic

Nazi Consul Is Charged as Spy

Fritz Wiedemann Heads Vast Espionage Setup in All Americas, Woman Says.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 5 (AP).—Consul General Fritz Wiedemann was represented Wednesday as heading a German espionage ring throughout the Americas, and as having ordered his agents to obtain secret information "beneficial to Germany . . . in its conquest of the Western Hemisphere."

The allegations were in a complaint filed for Mrs. Alice Crockett, former wife of a United States Army officer, who asked \$8,000 she said Wiedemann owed her for a trip to Germany in his behalf in 1939.

The complaint set forth that Wiedemann received more than \$5,000,000 from the German government for "espionage activity, that he employed many persons for such purposes, and that it was the duty of the Princess Stephanie, Hohenlohe, whom the United States is seeking to deport, to pay these employes."

The remainder of the complaint was made up of statements which Mrs. Crockett said Wiedemann made to her.

"Statements" Repeated.

He was alleged to have told her that he obtained information "to determine by what method the Panama Canal could be made useless," that he employed officials of the United States Government, that he hired workmen in vital industries to "foment class hatred," that he encouraged strikes to undermine United States defensive strength, and that he directed the German-American Bund.

Wiedemann also was represented as having said he "worked together" with Henry Ford and Col. Charles Lindbergh, and that he (Wiedemann) was "active in secretly storing large quantities of ammunition," particularly in the East and in New Jersey, "to be used by the . . . bund . . . in fighting against the United States Government."

The complaint said Wiedemann told Mrs. Crockett he had placed Dr. Friedhelm Draeger in charge of the East Coast German propaganda division, Dr. Mathias Schmitz in charge of the New York division, and Herman Schwinn in charge of the West Coast division.

Wiedemann, consul general here since early in 1939, denied all such charges when a similar suit was filed by Mrs. Crockett in superior court, and his attorney termed the action a "shakedown."

"Check Up" Trip.

The consular official was a superior officer of Adolf Hitler in the World War, and was Hitler's personal aid and confidant from Jan. 1, 1935, until coming here.

Mrs. Crockett's complaint said Wiedemann owed her \$3,000 for six months' service and \$5,000 in expenses for visiting Hitler and other high officials in Germany and ascertaining that they believed Wiedemann was "properly fulfilling" his duties as consul general and in the "espionage service."

The trip, the complaint said, was taken after Wiedemann had a "serious misunderstanding" with the German government.

The complaint asserted that Wiedemann remarked he "used" Colonel Lindbergh "to lull America and Americans into a sense of false security and into believing that America was and is safe from Germany and German attack." It said, too, that the consul general had stated he "worked together" with Ford "in furthering the German and Nazi cause in the United States."

STORY FORD AIDED BUND IS TERMED "OUTRAGEOUS LIE."

DETROIT, March 5 (AP).—Commenting on a complaint filed in federal court in San Francisco, I. A. Capizzi, attorney for the Ford Motor Company, said Wednesday night that "any statement that Henry Ford is working alone or with anyone else to further any foreign cause whatever is an outrageous lie."

Capizzi referred to the complaint by Mrs. Alice Crockett against Fritz Wiedemann, German consul-general at San Francisco, in which Wiedemann was said to have received more than \$5,000,000 from Germany for espionage in the United States and elsewhere in the Western Hemisphere.

The complaint, alleging that Wiedemann directed German-American Bund activities in the United States, said Wiedemann told Mrs. Crockett that he "worked together with" Col. Charles A. Lindbergh and Henry Ford.

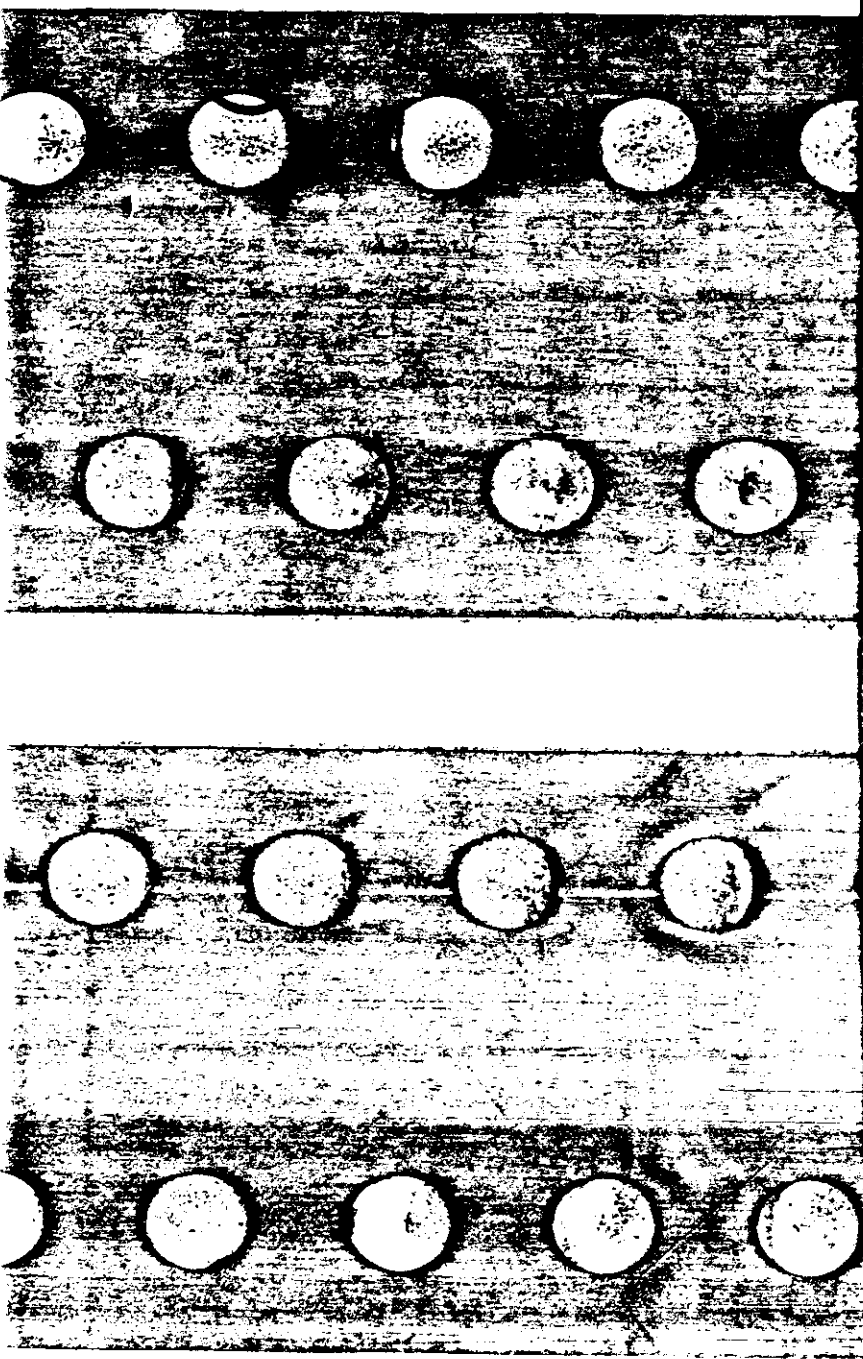

Weidmann Says Ford, Lindy Tale 'Fantasy'

By United Press

SAN FRANCISCO, March 6—German Consul General Fritz Wiedemann today denounced as "pure fantasy" a charge that he collaborated with Col. Charles A. Lindbergh and Henry Ford "to further the Nazi cause in this country."

The accusation was made by Mrs. Alice Crockett, 37 divorced wife of Lieut. Col. Gilman Crockett of Camp Jackson, S. C., who claims Capt. Wiedemann owes her \$8000 for five months of confidential work among his masters in Germany. She filed an amended suit yesterday in Federal Court.

'ALL BUNK'

"All bunk. From the first word to the last, it's all bunk. The whole thing's pure fantasy. That's all I have to say," Capt. Wiedemann commented at the consulate. He appeared amused, rather than angry.

A Ford spokesman said in Detroit that the suit "appears to be a publicity stunt."

Mrs. Crockett said Princess Stefanie Hohenlohe of Hungary was Capt. Wiedemann's agent, paying his workers in the United States.

Mrs. Crockett said Capt. Wiedemann told her, among other things, that:

Sigrid Schultz, Chicago Tribune correspondent, was employed by the German propaganda division to extol Nazism in dispatches to this country, and Capt. Wiedemann and his aides tried to determine the reaction to them.

The Panama Canal Zone was fertile ground for espionage, and Capt. Wiedemann knew how the canal could be made useless.

Government officials, plant superintendents, foremen and workmen in U. S. steel and munitions industries were in his pay.

NEW JERSEY ARSENAL

He directed activities of the German-American Bund and had stored secret arsenals in the United States, particularly in New Jersey, to be used at the opportune time.

She charged the German government gave Capt. Weidemann \$5,000,000 "to promote strife and class hatred in the United States," and he "did employ ruffins to stir racial hate . . . and pay such ruffins from funds of the German government . . . and did encourage strikes in all types and kinds of industries in the United States for the purpose of destroying unity and undermining the strength and ability of the United States to prepare for national defense."

Col. Lindbergh, she said, was Capt. Wiedemann's tool in efforts to "ull America and Americans into a sense of false security." She said the consul told her Col. Lindbergh was considered

the "best German propagandist in the country."

Mrs. Crockett said he owed her \$8,000 salary and expenses, for sounding out Adolf Hitler, Joseph Goebbels, and Field Marshal Herman Goering in 1939, about his work in this country. He feared they were dubious of his ability, she said, but she was able to report that they thought he was the best man available for the job.

Wiedemann was a captain in the World War; Hitler was his motorcycle dispatch rider.

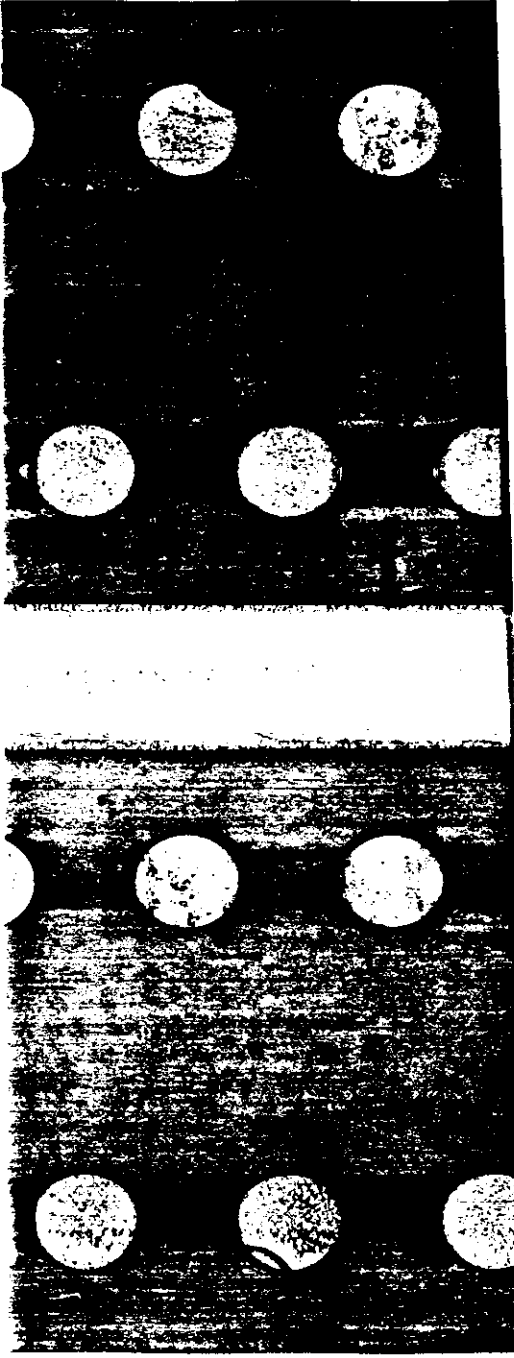



Roosevelt was elected by a landslide, as we all know, Roosevelt, along with 12 other prominent men, all of the Jewish faith, were to be taken for a "one way ride." It was just recently that I had discovered that the reason for my arrest was due to the fact that the Nazi needed a so-called political myth, and I was to be it, as I have been the sucker for nine years. Whenever I was arrested be it in New York, Chicago, Philadelphia or Miami, Florida, the Nazi and Fascist of America always made a political issue out of it and capitalized financially due to my arrest. I was to be the ^{most} worst wisoll of America, and if the so-called enemy did not kill me, then the Fascist would execute me, only then would my name be etched in the hearts of those who hate America, as a myth mythre to the cause for all movements are not to be considered movements unless baptized in the blood of their members.

The German propagandist accuse the Jews of playing both ends against the middle in a Jewish attempt to gain world control, i.e., "Juden, Juden, uber alles," but now that I am no longer mentally constipated, to me it appears that it is a German conspiracy for world control, or i.e., "Deutschland, Deutschland, uber alles," for North of the Mason-Dixon line ~~it is~~ it is the Jewish question (so-called — South of the Mason-Dixon line here in the United States it is the Catholic question, but strange as it may seem to you my dear American brother and sister, in South America it is not the Jewish question nor is it the Catholic question but rather it is, believe it or not, "Down with Yankee Imperialism" and by that I mean by snuffballs and crackers, in other words the Intelligence Service of the German

Must play both ends towards the middle or should I say the, "program of confusion", meaning what?, meaning that native born are played against foreign born, whites against blacks, blacks against whites, Catholics against Protestants, Protestants against Catholics through the K.K.K., all in all, it is Jew against Gentile, Gentile against Jew. We call ourselves a United Nation! We are not a United people, WE ARE THE MOST DISUNITED, DISORGANIZED PEOPLE ON THE FACE OF THE EARTH. You say that it can't happen here, what can't happen here? A Nazi invasion of the Americas, my dear friends, if you were with me for the past seven years as a member, as a leader, as a speaker and as a writer and as a page uttance of Hitler's Germany, then you would agree to this when I say that here in the United States the combined German forces are equipped with money and munitions and are ever ready at a moments notice to strike at the heart of the United States, both economically, politically, socially, industrially, etc. Do not forget the fact that in Brazil and the Argentine of South America, we have one of the largest German, Italian and Japanese ^{of course} communist in the Western Hemisphere who are likewise well organized and who control, i.e., to say, the German element in South America control aviation (aerobial) of the Latin-Americans. Do not forget the fact (AND I MEAN DO NOT FORGET) that to the North of us in Canada we are faced by an ever growing Canadian Fifth Column directed by Monsieur Andrioz (who is returned for the duration of the war). Upon more than one occasion I have seen maps of the United States in the headquarters of the Bund where Cities of America were renamed, as well as the States, names reading like those who of Germany. Unbelievable but true, 5th Ave. of New York is to be called the "Hitlerstrasse." The Germans both here and abroad have their eyes fixed on the United States. Their only desire is to see America lying in the dust of revolution. Many leading American political, military, and naval officials are openly and secretly collaborating with the agents of Hitler. You will find this in the leadership of the "American First Committee" and the "Citizens Committee to Keep Out of War." These so-called peace groups are working for the downfall of Great Britain.

Wendell Willkie, whose father Congressman Lindbergh, on the floor of Congress denounced both Jews and Catholics and later was found dead in a box-car, is the official spokesman for the "Aid Hitler but defeat Great Britain Club" and states that Germany has no intention of invading the United States. 



The following information is in regard to [redacted] whose identity is unknown to the Los Angeles Office at this time. An investigative file is being opened on him and further reports will be presented in the new file.

The first information secured was under date of September 5, 1940, when an unknown individual believed to be [redacted] from later information secured, attempted to contact [redacted] at the Deutsches Haus, and in the absence of [redacted] talked to one [redacted] believed to be [redacted] at the Deutsches Haus. This discussion was in regard to a new party, LINDBERGH for President and WHEELER for Vice-President, such a party to be supported by the K. K. K. [redacted] stated he would have circulars printed for the German Day Picnic at the park. [redacted] who has been the subject of many complaints in this office is believed to have been the propogandist for the caller). The unknown individual believed to be [redacted] stated that he was endorsed by the Chamber of Commerce, and [redacted] indicated that he would distribute some of the circulars for the caller at the German Day Picnic on Sunday; further that a poster would be put on the bulletin board at the German House so it could be seen by persons coming in; further that a fellow named NELSON (who is known to the Los Angeles Office as the head of the K. K. K. in Los Angeles) was mentioned. The information received at this time seemed to indicate that there are a lot of K. K. K. members who formerly hung around the German House, but discontinued the practice as they thought they might be listed as being pro-German. [redacted] stated that the men at the German House

would back up the individual believed to be [redacted] just like the boys at the German House would back up the LINDBERGH and WHEELER plan for President and Vice-President of the United States.

Under date of September 7, 1940, the individual believed to be [redacted] talked politics at the Deutsches Haus; spoke of [redacted] his wife and son, and believed that FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT would declare an emergency if [redacted] looked like he might win; that HITLER would win by November 15th. He also discussed the Presidential candidate ALMAZAN, and Mexican politics.

On September 8, 1940, the LINDBERGH for President Plan was again discussed by an unknown individual. It was learned that there were 5000 sympathizers at the park and they will all vote as the men at the German House do -- that is, for LINDBERGH.

It is believed that [redacted] telephone is [redacted]. Subsequent contacts between [redacted] and [redacted] indicated that [redacted] organization was the organization backing the LINDBERGH movement. [redacted] did not think much of the LINDBERGH for President plan. [redacted] advised [redacted] that he had talked to [redacted] when he was in Los Angeles and that it was his opinion that [redacted] was a Communist. [redacted] further indicated he would continue to hold his meetings; the next meeting was to be held on Tuesday, September 24, 1940. [redacted] further indicated that he intended to start a church in conjunction with his work calling it "The TRUE AMERICAN CHURCH." [redacted] thought this would be a good experiment.

Under date of September 25, 1940, contact was again had between [redacted] and [redacted] indicating his meeting of the night before was not so good; that there was some heckling; that [redacted] had been at the Consulate today and had been referred to [redacted] for some help. [redacted] advised [redacted] not to mention names outside of private discussions. Further contact was had between [redacted] and [redacted] under date of September 26, 1940, [redacted] advising [redacted] that he had received a letter from the "AMERICA FIRST" Committee. [redacted] indicated this was a good outfit to make contacts with, and stated [redacted] should open a local branch; that it would be better

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



The newspapers have mentioned that the Republicans may draft Lindbergh for vice president. If they think this is a new idea they are way behind the times. The Nazis had this idea a long time ago.

Several months ago before General Mosely was discredited, the Bund through their Chief Recruiting Agents and Germany's accredited Representatives Roedel Bros of 3299 Third Ave. New York City had formed a party to run Mosely for President and Lindbergh for Vice President. They were obtaining signatures on Petitions and had their Candidates names prominently displayed in their windows until sentiment about the Bund became a little too hot. Sees Attempt To Frighten Americans

Bowdoin Professor Deplores Talk

Special Despatch to The Press Herald Brunswick, May 23—Lashing out

at those who he alleges are seeking to confuse a well-meaning and honest public with nightmare apparitions, Prof. Newton P. Stallknecht, associate professor of philosophy at Bowdoin College, in a chapel address today urged the students to mature their opinions and make them heard. He quoted from a recent address by Admiral Yarnell that the United States is safe from foreign invasion.

Prof. Stallknecht termed the recent talk by Col. Charles Lindbergh as honest, intelligent, courageous opinion, but added it was presented a bit tactlessly.

"Why then all these alarms?" asked Prof. Stallknecht. "Why all this talk from high school to Congress of winged warriors descending upon us? Why this attempt to torture the public? Have they not heard enough already? Why repeat Orsen Welles' horrible fairy tale about the Martians? That, to be sure was an accident. But there is nothing accidental about its repetition.

"If the people desire to involve us in war for reasons of economics, of international morality or sheer prestige, let them speak out but their critics must require them to state their true reasons. And they should refrain from confusing a well-meaning and honest public with nightmare apparitions. We all know that the state of the world is bad enough as it is without such fantastic distortions.

"It is my belief that an effort is now being made to frighten the American people. We hear from the President of the United States a public statement of the flying times from Greenland to Maine and from Bermuda to New York City. And these seem merely to be offered as evidence that we cannot possibly stand aloof from the European conflict. To be

sure, the President does not — as yet at any rate — urge that we send troops to Europe — but he certainly seems willing to hint that a wolf of some sort may be soon at the door — a savage wolf with wings. He clearly wants us to believe that the United States is really considered in danger. He advocates a vast armament of airplanes — five times what one general considers adequate for defense. This armament is to be built under war-time measures which suspend competitive bidding, and some labor regulations which in recent years have been prepared to protect the forgotten man.

"Now of course we do not know what the Administration's next move will be. In fairness, we must admit that it may not be an unwise one. But it will be most unwise and unfair if it involves any further effort to frighten the public. A frightened public means a confused Congress that dares not appear to ignore popular excitement. And such a Congress is likely to do the wrong thing. No leader who frightens his people is a truly Democratic leader.

"Not so long ago one leader told us that grass would grow in the streets if he were not elected. And soon other leaders may be telling us that foreign bombs will be bursting in air if they are not reelected.

"Since I have gone so far it appears only fair to you that I state more fully my opinions concerning our proper attitude toward the war. I will not say that the European war is no concern of ours. It is very obviously a cause of great and distressful concern. We talk, these days, of little else and we must take an intelligent stand concerning it.

"The war abroad is a painful matter for all of us—it is inhuman to laugh at it or even to try to forget it. I am sure that everyone here is ready to contribute generously to the Red Cross funds and to offer help to refugees when the chance arises. Americans have experience in organizing such assistance and such help can be offered with a clean conscience.

"But there is no ground upon which our own Government has a right to interfere in this war. Our Government is not a militant benevolent society for policing the world. Since we have proceeded according to that assumption, we should not suddenly desire to enforce law and order on a grand scale in Europe or Asia. To desire to do so under these circumstances is nothing but militant sentimentalism—which is at once the worst kind of sentimentalism and almost the worst kind of militarism.

"With reasonable foresight and good leadership we may insure our safety and the continuity of our civilization for years to come and this is the only end we should instruct our government to pursue. This is not all. We should make certain that our government hears our instructions. There are involved in such a policy many special problems. Probable loss of much foreign trade is one of them. But even this is a small price to pay for the sanity and wholesome living which war is almost certain seriously to impair."

Dear Fellow American-

At the suggestion of a friend I am taking the liberty of writing you about Scribner's Commentator.

I felt that you would be interested to discover that one magazine exists in this confused land of ours which has the courage to speak out in behalf of common sense.

I say courage because the editorial policy we have adopted - the policy of thinking of America first and Europe second is not a popular one with the "Go To War Crush Hitler Now" minority who make the loudest noise and wield the most pressure these days.

Frankly we had some publishing doubts when we first lashed out on our campaign for reason. We were advised by every imaginable New York pressure group to desist. One prominent publishing executive warned us that if we ran a piece favorable to Lindbergh it would put the magazine out of business because "America thinks of Lindbergh as a traitor."

But we went ahead. As one of our directors said, "If this country has fallen so far that war-mongering playwrights are hailed as patriots while a Lindbergh is denounced as a foreign agent the sooner we find out about it the better."



On the evening of January 22, the American Destiny Party opened a membership drive in upper Manhattan with a meeting at the Glencoe Athletic Club, 159th St and Amsterdam Ave.

Between three and four hundred people crowded into the small drab hall. Strong-arm members of the Party stood at the door, scmtinizing everyone who entered.

Helmond acted as chairman, introducing the speakers JAMES DOWNEY, prominent Christian Fronter, FRANK WOODRUFF, stout garrulous pro-Nazi, and JOSEPH McWILLIAMS, the FÜHRER.

McWilliams chose for his theme the "History of the Jewish people". His rambling speach lasted mere than an hour. He advocated that the United States settle its "Jewish problem" in the same manner as " Egypt and Nazi Germany settled theirs".

On January 29, the Party held its second meeting at the Glencoe Athletic Club. As McWilliams had promised, the " Christian Directories" were distributed.

McWilliams himself described how they should be used. There were, he pointed out, four different directories, each covering a particular section in Manhattan.

This time, McWilliam's speach lasted almost two hours. He urged all of them to keep " little black books" in readiness for "The Day". He was keeping one of his own, he said. At the conclusion of this speach, McWilliams brought the audience to its feet by vemently declaring: " The day is not far off when we shall meet no more in a small hall like this. The day will soon come when our Party will fill Madison Square Garden to overflow and LINDBERGH and I will speak to you from the platform !"

On these billboards she advocated the release of MOONEY, and now has billboards on the property in connection with Col. SEAS. LINDBERGH'S recent radio broadcast.

[REDACTED] stated that he went by this property recently and noticed two cars with photographic equipment immediately in front of same, and within a few moments they were busily engaged in setting up their cameras directly in front of the LINDBERGH advertisement.

[REDACTED] said that they were so close to the board that their photograph would doubtless be entirely covered by the material on the board and nothing else. He said that he approached one of the men with a camera and inquired what was taking place. This man, he stated, was of foreign appearance and gave him no information. He then approached another of the men, who informed him that he was taking the pictures for Paramount Studios. [REDACTED] advised that this is ridiculous, as he cannot conceive of any reason for the studios wanting pictures of the billboard.

[REDACTED] advised that he took down descriptions of the cars and the individuals referred to and would mail them to the Los Angeles Office.

In view of the fact that [REDACTED] information did not indicate any violation of any Federal laws, no investigation is being made of the foregoing.

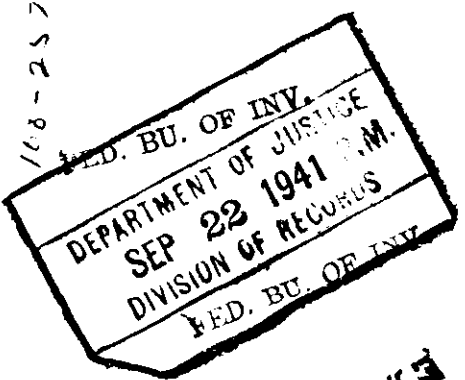

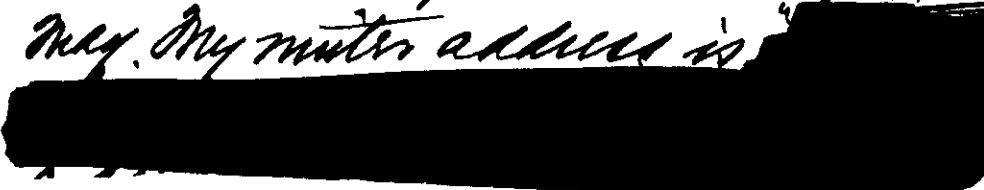

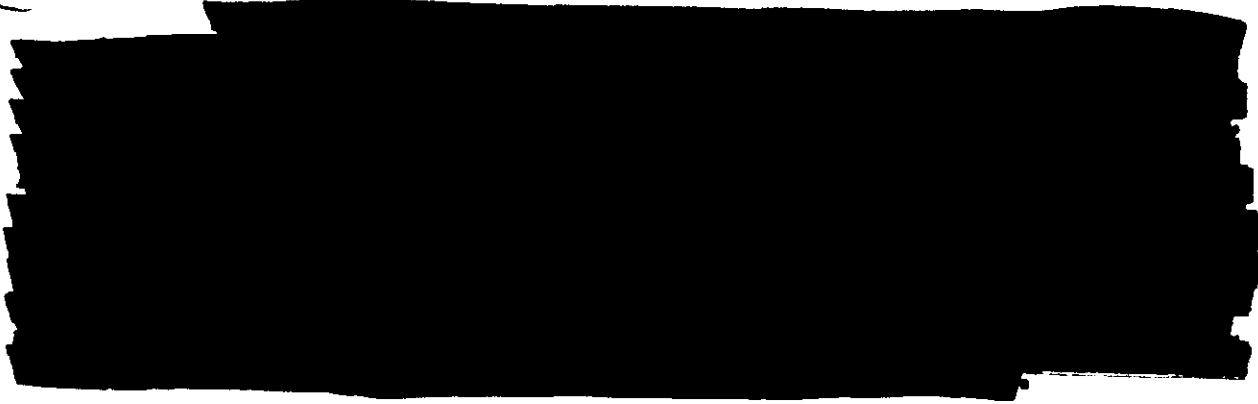

During the early part of the week, the experimental observation ship, the HELICOPTER, previously mentioned in these memorandums as being under construction in the Experimental Department, crashed at the nearby Bridgeport City Airport, and while being flown by its inventor. The ship was almost entirely demolished. Information from plant officials, based on conversations by them with persons acquainted with the crash, has resulted in information that the crash positively was caused by the mechanical failure of tail parts from a material standpoint and that no sabotage was seen therein. With reference to the Experimental Department, attention is invited to the writer's memorandum under date of October 12, 1940, page three, wherein it appears that Colonel CHARLES LINDBERGH had visited

the plant. Information from [REDACTED] was later to the effect that Colonel LINDBERGH had called for the purpose of flying the experimental ship, the "FIGHTER", but which was not accomplished as it was found that the motor mount connections were not strong enough to withstand the stress from the pull out of a power dive. 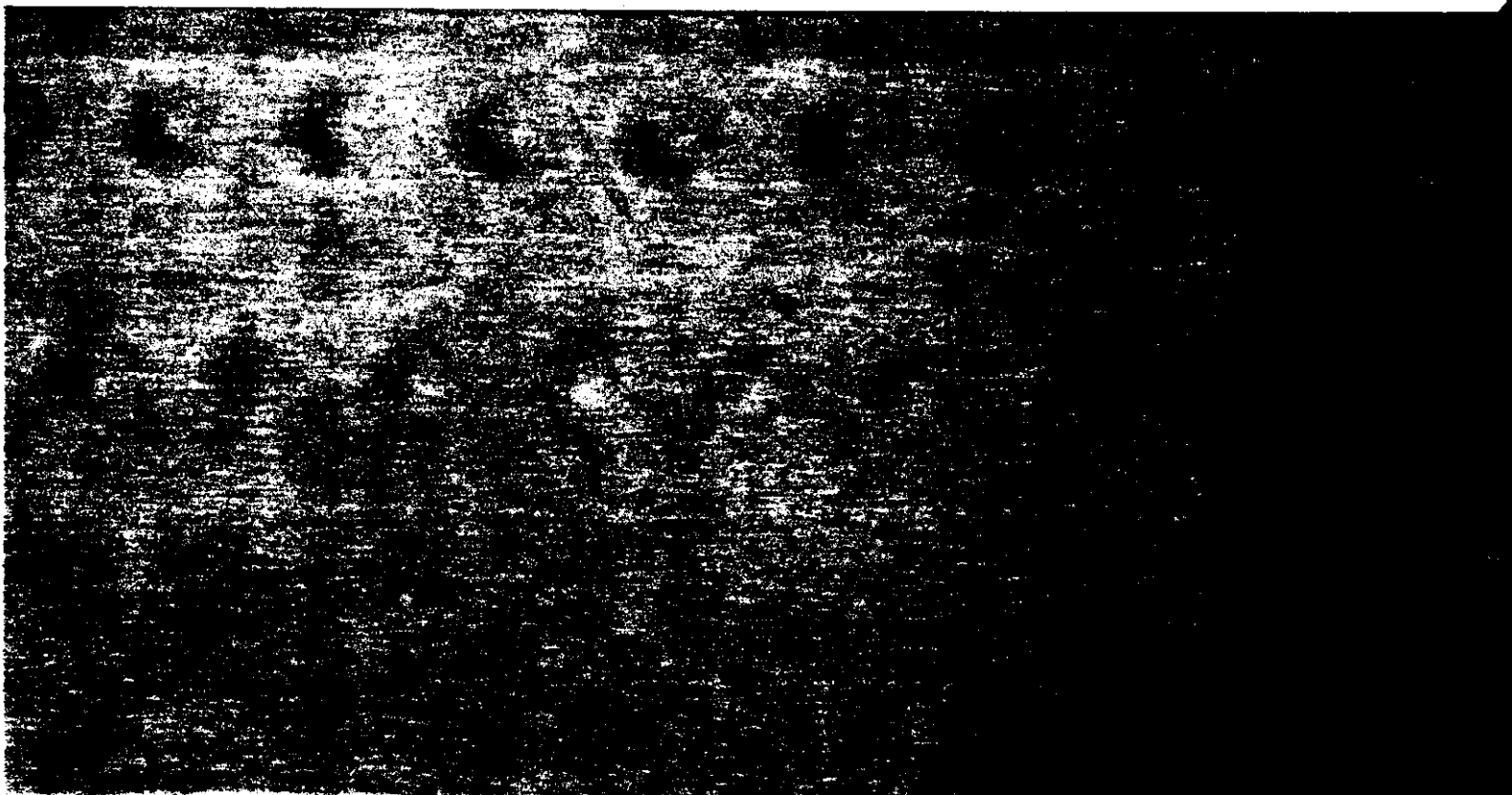

Extracts from the remarks of [REDACTED], at the meeting of the Associated Merchandising Corp. in Chicago, [REDACTED] b7c

Mr. Chairman, members of the A.M.C. After your last meeting here some months ago, in your Chicago offices, Mr. Rosenberg rather intimated to me that I had been optimistic in my viewpoint. I certainly did not feel optimistic, at that time, and apparently I was only afraid to show the extent of my pessimism.

It has always seemed to me that since August 1939, when I received a letter from my German friend, [REDACTED] saying "We will invade Poland on September 1st and Poland will cease to exist as a nation in 30 days - then it will be France's turn, then England's, then, [REDACTED] we shall see who won the last war," that this was "our war" and from its very inception. It is our war now, we surely know. Or do we? b7c

In the words of Life's editor, Mr. Luce, "We cannot win this war until we come to the knowledge that we might lose it."

This war will be the longest, most ruthless and bloodiest war you ever heard of. It will not all be fought in Borneo, "or what have you" but will very conceivably be fought partly between San Francisco and New York and very likely in Alaska, in Mexico and most assuredly in Panama and, of course, in Africa, in Europe and in Australia. This is truly a World-Wide War.

Neither Japan nor Germany will collapse, at least not in any conceivable immediate future. The Philippines are gone. Singapore, the Indies, even Turkey and Africa may fall and soon. And, no matter, except that another million men will die and the war will last another year. Mistake it not, there is but one enemy that we face and that we must defeat and that enemy is Nazi Germany. Japan will fall when Germany falls and not one hour before.

There is but one grave, great and immediate danger to America, namely that England may be invaded. If the British Isles fall, our situation is desperate indeed, for Britain is the "nerve center" of all resistance today, even though Russia is the "strong right arm" at the moment.

As yet we have no adequate army. Rather, a large group of individuals. A Buyer here in Chicago told me recently that if one single German landed at New York, he would take his rifle and go down. He meant this as a patriotic gesture but really it is defeatist in its effect. For, if we, you and I, "wait" until Nazis land anywhere then we are on the verge of defeat and we, as well as Mussolini, will be "lackeys" to the "Herren Volk" - the "Master Race". It is we that must do the "landing" or we will indeed, be the slave state.

The American Quislings have not changed their minds, they are merely biding their time. All hell will be to pay in these beloved United States of ours, and, when the going gets tough, watch the Darlan's and the Laval's in America and the Lindbergh's and the Nye's and the Coughlin's. They show signs of having the "Gauleiter" complex.

Housewares are important to America, they always have been, I hope they always will be. Housewares are important, even to victory. We must all do the best we can, must substitute, must improvise and must carry on and quit "bellyaching".

It will not help to quit or give up or lay down on our respective jobs. You will do less business in 1942 than you did in 1941. You had best make a larger mark-up to pay your increasing overhead. Our firm is rapidly bring our pricing policy to a point where we can allow a full and satisfactory margin to our key accounts. The manufacturer who "cuts" your discount today is doing you a grave disservice, when your costs are mounting against the possible restriction of sales due to rationing or to some equivalent.

Beh & Company wants to tell you that we are selling our merchandise to our regular department store and jobbing accounts exactly as we always have done. We have not solicited nor accepted any new and large catalog or chain store business. Neither have we sold the hundreds of premium, chain, furniture and "schlag" houses who are coming in to see us in droves, both here at the Housewares Show in Chicago, and in our New York office. We are not, have not and will not sell the second story "discount houses" that you so justly complain of (and about which you do nothing).

All our items are for your counters and for the shelves of our other established and key accounts. We have, to date, filled 90% of your orders complete. We are still doing so and can continue, we feel, longer than the average of your resources.

May I say, also, that wood products are becoming scarce and will shortly be as difficult to obtain, perhaps as steel. To those who say "how come?" and add "the oamps are all built", I reply, the oamps have not even been started as yet and relatively speaking, of course.


A concrete case is the cancelling of 21 cars of lumber due us at the present time. Another 3 cars of Southern pine also suddenly taken by government priorities and only last week.

Do not believe that the government will freeze your legitimate stocks of normal housewares, nor any items therein. Freezing of automobile stocks has no bearing on housewares. Naturally with auto production stopped, cars on hand must not be "gobbled up" by those with ready cash in their jeans, but must, in all conscience, be rationed, if that be the right word, but of course "sold" to those individuals and firms whose service to the public most urgently requires new transportation.

No car dealer will have his cars requisitioned or will lose his investment as the appeasers are apt to "whisper".

Rumor mongering, cursing the government, daming Roosevelt, daming England; apologizing for Hitler, condemning the Catholics, "God-daming" the Jews, all will not help us win this war. Let us stop these dangerous, if unconscious fifth columnists.

Her reason for suspicioning [REDACTED] Espionage activities was that during a conversation with [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED]

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store, while looking at antiques, she had told him that she had lived in Germany and he seemed very interested. He told her that his wife was German and that they had formerly lived in Frankfort, Germany. During the course of their conversation, he spoke of "our man Lindbergh" and seemed extremely annoyed at himself for having made this statement. Informant stated that she would have attached no significance to this statement except that she had heard from another source that the Fascists in this country planned to use LINDBERGH as a front man for Fascist activities in this country. She was unable to state where she had heard this information.
