various newspapers, including the "Daily Worker," had carried articles to the effect that he had been connected with various Communist front activities, and that on the basis of this information Sinatra was denied permission to entertain troops. Sinatra was advised this decision was based solely upon newspaper articles. Sinatra in reply stated he hated Communism and had never been a member of a Communist organization. He further stated that he would carry this matter to the Attorney General in order to clear his name and he would engage counsel to represent him. No information appears in Bufiles that Sinatra has as yet contacted the Attorney General.

On 10-25-54, Mr. George Murphy, who in recent years has played an active role in sending movie entertainers to various parts of the world to entertain Armed services, telephonically contacted Mr. Nichols to discuss this matter. Mr. Murphy was advised that it must have been the Army's own decision not to use Sinatra based on the Army's own record. Since the matter of determining what actors are to visit the various theaters is one for the determination of the defense establishments and the various branches of the Armed services, it was suggested, therefore, that Mr. Murphy contact the Army in this regard. Murphy indicated, however, that he intended to withdraw from this matter. (62-83219-29,30,31)

On 12-14-54 a name check request concerning Sinatra was received from the State Department in connection with a passport application. On 12-30-54 the Department of State was advised that the FBI had conducted no active investigation of Sinatra. Also the memorandum provided information received by the FBI concerning Sinatra which is in summary: Sinatra has allegedly been connected in varying degrees such as sponsorship and/or membership with 13 Communist front groups or activities in Los Angeles, Detroit, and New York City. One informant alleged in 1945 that he had been told that Sinatra had recently been admitted to membership in the New York Branch of the Communist Party. This informant was described as confidential and reliable. Sinatra's association with numerous gangsters and hoodlums including Lucky Luciano and Willie Moretti were set out. It was also noted that in 1948 Sinatra was scheduled to transcribe an anti-Communist broadcast for Italian consumption and that as of 1951 Sinatra was listed as a participant in an anti-Communist rally. *RU*

On 1-10-55 Sinatra executed a sworn affidavit for the Passport Division of the State Department at New York County, New York, stating that he was not then and had never been a member of the Communist Party, any so-called Communist front organizations or any other group or organization of a subversive character. As of 2-17-55 the Washington Field Office was advised in confidence that the Passport Division of State Department was sending two copies of the above affidavit to the Department "with request for investigation to determine whether criminal proceedings against subject for apparent violation of 18 USC 1542 warranted." Section 1542 is "false statement in application and use of passport." Los Angeles and New York were advised of this information. Sinatra is the well-known singer and motion picture actor.

SYNOPSIS:

On 1-10-55, Sinatra executed a sworn affidavit for the Passport Division of the State Department at New York City, stating that he was not then and had never been a member of the Communist Party (CP) or of any organization of a subversive character. On 2-17-55, the Washington Field Office was advised in confidence that the Passport Division was sending the above affidavit to the Department with a request for investigation to determine whether criminal proceedings against Sinatra for making a false statement in an application for a passport were warranted. The Director agreed with Mr. Tolson's suggestion that a complete summary be prepared on Sinatra. As yet the Bureau has not been requested to conduct any investigation. There is attached a summary memorandum concerning Sinatra dated 9-29-50. This memorandum reflects the following information concerning him: Sinatra never investigated by the Bureau, however, in 1944 a limited inquiry was made into his Selective Service status following the receipt of an anonymous letter that he had paid \$40,000 for 4F classification. Inquiry established that Sinatra was rejected for military service because of an ear ailment and emotional instability. Sinatra born Hoboken, New Jersey, December 12, 1915, 1916, or 1917. Arrested Sheriff's Office, Hackensack, New Jersey, on charge of Seduction in 1938, charge dismissed; arrested April 9, 1947, Hollywood, California, on charge of Battery. No disposition given. In 1950, Sinatra, through another party, offered his services to the Bureau as he felt that due to publicity connecting him with subversive groups, he might be of service to the Bureau. His offer was declined. In 1945, an informant described as reliable [redacted] stated that he had heard from other CP members that Sinatra was a member of the CP. Sinatra has been associated with numerous groups cited by the Attorney General, the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA), or California Committee on Un-American Activities as a sponsor or as a speaker. In 1946, he was elected as one of the vice-chairmen of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions (ICCASP) in New York City. The ICCASP has been cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities. The summary reflects that he was associated with such

well known hoodlums as Willie Moretti, Ralph Capone (reported to be a relative), Fischetti brothers, and Charles "Lucky" Luciano. It has been reported that Moretti and Capone financed Sinatra's career. In 1947, Sinatra received considerable publicity when he associated with Luciano in Cuba. A review of Bureau files from 1950 to date reflected that Sinatra was reported in 1950, by a source of unknown reliability, to have taken \$1,000,000 cash to Luciano in Italy, and to have attended a Mafia meeting in 1951 in Cuba. As of February, 1954, his name appeared on the license of the Sands Hotel, Las Vegas, Nevada, a gambling house. Newspaper articles indicate that Sinatra is now anti-Communist.

RECOMMENDATION:

DETAILS:

Washington Field Office has received information on 2-17-55 that the Passport Division of the State Department was sending two copies of an affidavit executed by Sinatra to the Department along with a request for investigation to determine whether criminal proceedings against subject for apparent violation of 18 USC 1542 were warranted (false statement, in application for US passport). On October 1, 1955, Sinatra executed a sworn affidavit for the Passport Division of the State Department in New York City, stating that he was not then or had never been a member of the Communist Party or of any organization of a subversive character. To date the Bureau has received no request to investigate this matter. The Director agreed with Mr. Tolson's suggestion that a complete summary be prepared on Sinatra.

There is attached a summary memorandum dated September 29, 1950, a brief summary of which is set out in the synopsis of this memorandum. Bureau files were reviewed from September, 1950 to date.

A review of our files since September, 1950, reflected the

The General Investigative Intelligence Files of the New York office, dated April 15 through October 15, 1954, reported that Frank Sinatra was alleged to have been present in 1951 at a meeting of members of the Mafia in Cuba. Lucky Luciano was also reported as attending this meeting. (62-75147-34-205 page 105)

As of February 16, 1954, Sinatra was listed on the license of the Sands Hotel, Las Vegas, Nevada, a gambling house. (62-75147-44-576)

✓ The "Daily Worker" an east coast Communist newspaper, of April 10, 1951, contained an article captioned "Where Are the Big Stars Who Once Opposed the Un-Americans?" The article mentioned Frank Sinatra as one who had at one time made strong statements against the HCUA but was now silent. (100-138754-835 page 43)

✓ The New York "Daily News" of April 27, 1951, reported that on the preceding day the Stop-Communism Committee was launched to fight against "Red influence in the entertainment world." Sinatra was listed as participating in a rally sponsored by the Committee. (100-138754-835 page 58)

In 1954, Sinatra volunteered to go to Korea for the Christmas season to entertain the troops. However, his offer was refused by the Army. On September 16, 1954, Sinatra talked with Army officers regarding the Army's refusal to permit him to entertain troops in Korea, and the Army informed him that the refusal was based on various newspaper articles to the effect that he had been connected with various Communist front activities. Sinatra stated at that time that he hated Communism and he had never been a member of a Communist organization. that

A summary of information in Bureau files concerning Sinatra was furnished the Department of State on December 30, 1954. One Photostat of this summary is attached for each of the offices receiving copies of this letter.

By memorandum of March 7, 1955, Assistant Attorney General Tompkins requested an investigation of Sinatra to determine if sufficient evidence exists to warrant prosecution of Sinatra under Section 1001 and 1542 of Title 18, U.S.C. 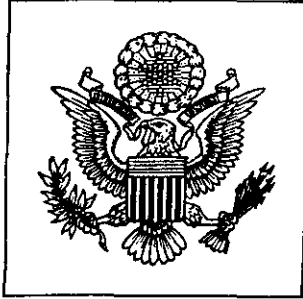



He attempts to commercialize with his alleged past connection with the CP and his life. He was convicted in 1948 in United States District Court, Washington, D. C., in connection with his placing anti-Communist signs on the grounds of the Soviet Embassy, Washington, D. C. He regularly goes on speaking tours and makes extravagant claims of Communist plans and policies. In 1951 he was arrested in Denver, Colorado, because he ripped the Soviet flag in a United Nations display at the Denver Civic Center. He has expressed great willingness to testify in any trial in which the Government would request using him as a witness.

Also, the only contacts with GOFF by the Denver Office have been upon specific request by the Bureau in loyalty and applicant type cases, and in each instance where possible, the Denver Office would obtain a signed statement from GOFF, who readily furnished same and who readily volunteered to appear before any court of law or hearing board to testify as to the facts in his signed statements.

KENNETH GOFF is a self-styled free lance Evangelist who for the past number of years has been speaking around the U. S. regarding the threat of Communism to the U. S. GOFF is a self-admitted former member of the Communist Party at Madison and Milwaukee, Wisconsin during the years 1936 to 1939 and claims to have been a leading functionary of the Communist Party of the U. S. during those years.

In the case entitled [REDACTED] report of SA [REDACTED] dated 7/4/45 at Denver, the Bureau was advised that GOFF organized the "Christian Youth for America" at Englewood, Colorado, in December, 1943, and published a monthly newspaper, "The Pilgrim Torch" that was closely associated with GERALD L. K. SMITH.

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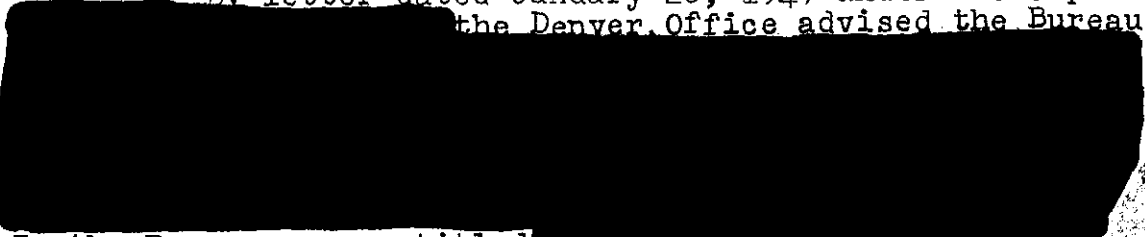

In the Bureau case entitled _____, GOFF was found guilty by jury trial on February 25, 1948, in United States District Court, District of Columbia, and was fined \$100 as a result of the subject's placing anti-Communist signs before the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D.C. GOFF furnished a signed statement in this case admitting participation in placing these signs on the grounds of the Soviet Embassy on July 31, 1947.

GOFF has been a controversial figure at Denver and Englewood, Colorado, for the past number of years and presently resides at 3406 South Bryant Street, Englewood, Colorado. In GOFF's speaking tours he also creates considerable controversy, which has resulted in many individuals and Bureau offices writing to the Bureau and the Denver Office concerning his activities. In GOFF's speaking tours he speaks on the following subjects:

- "Treason in Our State Department"
- "Red Secret Plot for Seizure of Denver"
- "Do the Reds Plan to Come by Alaska"
- "Should We Use the Atom Bomb"
- "The New Bible. Is It of Communist Origin"
- "What is the Kremlin's Next Move"
- "Traitors in the Pulpit, or What's Behind the Flying Saucers - Are They from Russia, Another Planet or God?"

Also, some of the titles of GOFF's books, which he publishes voluminously are:

- "Will Russia Invade America"
- "One World A Red World"
- "Confessions of Stalin's Agent"

The "Rocky Mountain News" on October 25, 1951, contained an article stating that, "Three Englewood persons were ordered to appear in Denver Municipal Court as an aftermath

You wouldn't say FRANK SINATRA was a Communist, would you?

"SMITH:

He may not be that intelligently, but he certainly is being used by the CP because when you take a man that is publicized as he is and then direct the spotlight that leads right to a young Communist banquet, you overtake millions of young people unprepared for that sort of persuasion and lead them to believe that Communism is respectable.

"Mr. THOMAS:

Would you say he was sort of a Mrs. ROOSEVELT in pants? (laughter)

"SMITH:

Well, I would not want to represent myself as an authority on that, but I would say this, Congressman, that I am convinced that FRANK SINATRA is not a naive dupe. He has been appearing recently and frequently at meetings known to be set up by the CP.

"Mr. THOMAS:

He and I live in the same county in New Jersey.

"SMITH:

Well, of course you must consider the SINATRA vote. I don't think they are for you."

Page 47, Paragraph one, of SMITH's testimony before the HCUA is quoted as follows:

~~"There is a cabal in California which includes Congress-~~
~~man PATTERSON, HELEN CAHAGAN, ORSEY WELLS, FRANK SINATRA,~~
and INGRID BERGMAN, who are playing with STALIN's first line."

Page 54 of SMITH's testimony is as follows:

"SMITH:

Here is a copy of a telegram I sent to Miss BERGMAN and I think I sent a copy to this committee.

"Mr. ADAMSON:

What is the date of it?

"SMITH:

1/12/46." (The telegram mentioned above is quoted as follows:)

"It is reported that on December 16 you participated in a program held under the auspices of the American Union for Democracy at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, together with FRANK SINATRA and others. About the same time, J. EDGAR HOOVER, speaking before the Catholic Youth Organization of New York City, asserted this organization was successor to the Young Communist League and was positively organizing a campaign to undermine our American government. Did you appear at this banquet with an intelligent understanding of its sponsorship, or were you the innocent victim of a slick program committee? A copy of this telegram has been forwarded to the Congressional Committee to Investigate Un-American Activities and to J. EDGAR HOOVER."

"I received no reply or recognition to that."

The following is taken from hearings before the Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 80th Congress, on H.R. 1884, and H.R. 2122 Bills to curb or outlaw the Communist Party of the U.S., 3/24-28/47.

Page 264, this report, is contained testimony of JACK B. TENNEY, State Senator, Sacramento, California, on 3/26/47:

"Mr. MUNDT:

Am I correct in my memory that FRANK SINATRA addressed the American Youth for Democracy Organization?

"TENNEY:

That is right. He was a sponsor of that organization, also one of the sponsors at a banquet given by them at which they presented awards to certain Young Communists who were present. FRANK SINATRA and many others have supported Youth for American Democracy in California.

"Mr. MUNDT:

Has he ever repudiated the American Youth for Democracy?

"TENNEY:

Not to my knowledge.

"Mr. MUNDT:

Was it declared by J. EDGAR HOOVER to be a Communist Front Organization for Youth in this country?

"TENNEY:

Yes, no; I have never heard any repudiation. That is one of the amazing things our committee has found."

Page 294 of the hearings on 1884 etc., contained the testimony of ERIC JOHNSTON, President, Motion Picture Association of America, in which a mention of FRANK SINATRA was made. This testimony is quoted as follows:

"RICHARD B. VAIL:

Testimony before this committee in the last few days has indicated that there are several prominent figures in the moving picture industry, prominent actors in particular, who support Communist activities. I have in mind, in particular, the names that have been mentioned: MARCH, ROBINSON, SINATRA and CAGNEY. In your opinion (Mr. JOHNSTON), are those individuals concerned with the progress of Communism in this country?

"Mr. JOHNSTON:

I have no knowledge to that effect. "

Page 298 contained further testimony of JOHNSTON. This testimony was as follows:

"Mr. MUNDT:

It doesn't work out that way. We asked Senator TENNEY from your state of California, yesterday for example, whether or not it was correct that one of your constituents, Mr. SINATRA, had addressed and endorsed the American Youth for Democracy in California, and he said he had. We have exposed the AYD as a Communist Organization. J. EDGAR HOOVER has exposed it as a Communist Organization. There is no longer any doubt because the CP admits parenthood of the AYD, but so far as the record reveals, Mr. SINATRA has never, at any time, dupe though he may be, taken himself away from his endorsement of the movement. It doesn't always work that way, does it?

"Mr. JOHNSTON:

In most instances that I know of it has.

"Mr. MUNDT:

And where it has, I agree that we should not be unduly suspicious of the dupe, but where a man in the position of Mr. SINATRA fails or declines

or refuses to remove his endorsement of the Communist Organization, don't you feel that that is inimical to the best interests of America?

"Mr. JOHNSTON:

I am unfamiliar with the facts."

The following is the testimony of WALTER S. STEELE regarding Communist activities in the U.S. On 7/21/47, Mr. STEELE testified before the committee chaired by J. PARNELL THOMAS. The following is the testimony of Mr. STEELE in regard to FRANK SINATRA:

Page 80, Paragraph 4, of this testimony is quoted as follows:

English

"The American Youth for a Free World later announced that it had received a call to the World Youth Conference in January, 1945, and it accordingly held a meeting of representatives of the Youth Movements of the U.S. at which was set up a U.S. Arrangements Committee for the World Youth Conference. The conference was held in London in November, 1945. The members of the Arrangements Committee, in turn, elected delegates to the conference. The delegates included MEYER BASS, New York City; GLOSTER CURRENT, New York City; NAOMI CHERTOFF, New York City; FRANCES DAMON, New York City; LAWRENCE DAY, Washington, D. C.; JOSEPH ENGEL, New York City; ELSA GRAVES, Long Island; ELIZABETH GREEN, Boston; ALICE HORTON, New York City; MURIEL JACOBSON, New York City; ESTHER COOPER, Jackson, Alabama; RUSSELL JONES, New York City; MOLLIE LIEBER, ALEXANDER MAPP, LEMPIR MATTHEWS, ELIZABETH MC CANDLESS, THOMAS NEILL, ANN POSTMA, DORIS SENK and OLIVIA STOKES. FRANK SINATRA is credited by them with having assisted in raising funds to defray the expenses of the delegates to the World Conference."

Page 106, Paragraph 5, of STEELE's testimony is quoted as follows:

"Also active in the play and film field is the IWO which sponsored road shows and film entertainment of an educational nature. Short films by FRANK SINATRA are also featured. CHARLES COOPER is National Director of IWO activities."

He stated that he did not know why subject was going to come to Schenectady, but stated that it was common Communist Party practice to use the names of prominent individuals, stating that these individuals were "comrades," so as to help the Communist Party cause. He advised he knew of no information which would place subject in the YCL at that time. *eu*

Considerable investigation has been conducted by the Los Angeles Office and other Bureau offices in connection with the instructions outlined in referenced letter. A review and analysis of the results of the investigation fails to develop any positive evidence connecting SINATRA with the Communist Party or the Communist Party movement.

In view of the foregoing, it is believed that the submission of a regular investigative report setting forth the results of the many interviews undertaken would be preferable to the preparation of a prosecutive summary due to the absence of the calibre of information which should logically be incorporated in a prosecutive summary report.

It is noted that the miscellaneous information furnished by informants in years past, and which was summarized by the Bureau in memorandum form dated 9/30/54, is essentially hearsay, most of which even if true, would have little probative value. The two most significant allegations contained in the summary are those set forth on Page 6, Paragraph 2, and Page 11, Paragraph 1. Reinvestigation of these two items brought forth the following results:

The SINATRAS' date and place of marriage were set forth as February 4, 1939, Jersey City, New Jersey, and their date of separation as February 1, 1950. Their children

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were listed as FRANK SINATRA, JR., age six years; CHRISTINA SINATRA, age twenty months; and NANCY SINATRA, age ten years.

On October 15, 1951 Mrs. NANCY SINATRA filed a complaint for divorce against FRANK SINATRA, charging extreme cruelty, Case No. SMD 8885. An interlocutory decree of divorce was granted on October 30, 1951, and a final decree on November 6, 1952. FRANK SINATRA was ordered by the court to pay to the plaintiff one-third of his annual income up to \$150,000.00, plus a lesser percentage of his income in excess of that amount.

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Mr. GUTHRIE furnished to SA [redacted] the following disposition of SINATRA's arrest on November 26, 1938:

Under Docket Number 15228 of that court in the State Against FRANK SINATRA SINATRA was charged on December 26, 1938 by [redacted] New Jersey, with having committed the following offense:

"On the second and ninth days of November, 1938 at the Borough of Lodi . . . under the promise of marriage, (SINATRA) did then and there have sexual intercourse with the said complainant who was then and there a single female of good repute . . . contrary to and in violation of the revised statute of 1937."

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The Peerless Casualty Company, 241 Main Street, Hackensack, New Jersey, went bond for SINATRA in the amount of \$1,500.00. This complaint was withdrawn on December 7, 1938 because it was ascertained that the complainant was, in fact, married. In place of that complaint and under Docket Number 15307, State Against FRANK SINATRA, a complaint was filed on December 21, 1938 by [redacted] New Jersey, charging SINATRA with adultery, in that he On the second and ninth days of November, 1938 . . . did then and there commit adultery with the said complainant, a married woman, the wife of [redacted] SINATRA went bond for himself in the amount of \$500.00. On January 4, 1939 the case was remanded to the Grand Jury by order of Judge McINTYRE.

Under Docket Number 18450 for the Prosecutor of the Pleas of Bergen County, it appears that a "No Bill" was returned on January 17, 1939 by the Grand Jury in connection with the second complaint. In accordance with the "No Bill," the complaint was dismissed in open court of Quarters Sessions of Bergen County on January 24, 1939.

"Cervase T. Murphy, Calumet Mich., Supreme Director of K of C, charged at Cincinnati that Sinatra was being used to 'woo the younger generation in the United States' to communism.

"Murphy's statement is a complete distortion,' Sinatra said. 'The minute anyone tries to help the little guy he's called a Communist. It's getting so I expect crackpots to say things like that.

"There may have been several Communists in the audience. Madison Square Garden is a big place. But I personally always have been opposed to communism."

The "Daily People's World" is a West Coast Communist newspaper.

The New York "Mirror" newspaper,
Issue of April 5, 1948

The above issue of the New York "Mirror" contained an article captioned "Sinatra to Stage Radio Plea to Italy for Defeat of Reds," carrying the name LOUELLA PARSONS in the by-line. The item read, in part, as follows:

"An appeal broadcast directly to the Italian people to vote against the Communist ticket in the April 18, 1948 election is being arranged for by Frank Sinatra. . . ."

The article went on to state, "Sinatra, who returned from New York today, was asked by Washington officials to get together a show with famous guests of Italian parentage, and Frankie gladly accepted the assignment to help fight Communism. Twenty-seven recordings will be made and played in various parts of Italy in an effort to reach even the most remote part of that troubled nation. . . ."

Los Angeles "Herald-Express"
newspaper, Issue of June 9, 1949

The above issue of the Los Angeles "Herald-Express" carried an item bearing the caption "Angelenos Deny Ties to Communists." The article read, in part, as follows:

"A torrent of denials came today from Californians who were listed by State Senator Jack B. Tenney as being under the influence of 'the Stalinist orbit'. . . ."

Included in the list of names set forth appeared the following--"Crooner Frank Sinatra: 'This unfair and unjustified attack gives every American good reason to be critical of the Tenney Committee.'"

"Hollywood on Trial--The Story of the Ten Who Were Indicted" by GORDON KAHN, published by Boni and Gaer, Inc., 133 West 44th Street, New York 18, New York, Copyright 1948

The following, attributed to FRANK SINATRA, appeared at page 19 in the above book:

"Frank Sinatra said once they get the movies throttled how long will it be before the Committee goes to work on freedom of the air? How long will it be before we're told what we can and cannot say into a radio microphone? If you make a pitch on a nation-wide network for a square deal for the underdog, will they call you a Commie? Will we have to think Mr. Rankin's way to get in the elevator at Radio City? Are they gonna scare us into silence? I wonder."

The above book pertained to the so-called "Hollywood Ten," previously referred to in this report.



Information concerning Sinatra's execution of an affidavit for the Passport Division of the Department of State on January 10, 1955, appears on page seven of the enclosed report. In his affidavit, Sinatra denied past or present membership in the Communist Party or in any group or organization of a subversive character.

Information beginning on page 18 of the enclosed report reflects that "The Independent" dated February 13, 1946, published by the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, listed the name of one Frank Sinatra among ten names under the heading "Vice Chairmen." The California Committee on Un-American Activities report for 1948 on page 262 describes the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions as a "Communist front."

Dear Lou:

It's been a long time since we worked on a story together, but now that I've escaped the Collier's debacle by moving over to LOOK, I hope I'll get to do FBI stories again and that we'll be seeing each other real soon.

In the meantime, however, I wonder if you could do me a favor. I'm currently doing a definitive, three-part profile for LOOK on Frank Sinatra. In the course of my research, I've come across constant allegations that Sinatra and members of his family have been arrested and perhaps convicted of crimes. I have been able to find no proof that these allegations are true. There is no record with the Hoboken or Jersey City, N.J., Police Departments, but it has been hinted to me by several authoritative sources that the records may have been removed.

If so, would there be any duplicate records filed with the FBI? Also, would I be able to look at such records, if they exist?

The allegations are as follows:

- (1) That Sinatra was arrested for rape in Jersey City or Hoboken around 1934. The charge is supposed to have been reduced to seduction and then thrown out by the Grand Jury. (Westbrook Pegler has reported this several times in his columns.)
- (2) That Sinatra was arrested and convicted of assault around the same time. (Another printed Pegler item.)
- (3) That Mrs. Natalie Sinatra, his mother, was arrested six or seven times for operating an abortion mill in Hoboken between the years 1930 and 1950 and that she might have been convicted once.
- (4) That Sinatra's uncles, Champ and Lawrence Garaventi, were arrested and perhaps convicted of bootlegging in Hoboken in the 1930's and early 1940's.

I realize these are serious charges, and I am keeping no copies of this letter because I do not want to perpetuate a slander if they are



not true. That's why I am writing this letter at home, instead of dictating it to my secretary at the office. Even if the charges are true, I will not use them in the story. The knowledge of them, however, will give me guidance in handling Sinatra's early life, since I have two completely contradictory versions: one, of a clean-living youth from a tough but good family, and two, that of a wild, ungovernable kid from a not-so-exemplary family.

Therefore, I'd appreciate it if you could give me some off-the-record advice, even if you are not permitted to let me see the actual records. If you don't want to put these facts in a letter, I'll be glad to fly down to Washington to see you. If you can't discuss the matter at all, I understand your position thoroughly and will not pursue the matter further.

SYNOPSIS:

Frank Sinatra was born December 12, 1915 or 1916, at Hoboken, New Jersey, of Italian-born parents. He left high school in 1935 to obtain employment and during that year, began his singing career in night clubs and road houses in the northern New Jersey area. He was married in 1939 to Nancy Barbato and has three children by that marriage. He divorced her in 1951 and married actress Ava Gardner, from whom he was separated after approximately two years of marriage. Allegations concerning his contacts with the Communist Party and numerous communist front groups came to the Bureau's attention for a number of years and were included in a memorandum sent to the State Department in December, 1954, on their request for a name check on Sinatra. In view of a sworn affidavit, executed by him on January 10, 1955, in connection with his application for a passport, to the effect that he had never been a member of the Communist Party or of any organization of a subversive character, the State Department requested an investigation by the Bureau to determine whether prosecution was warranted against Sinatra for making a false statement in the application.

The investigation developed no evidence connecting Sinatra with the Communist Party or any of its front groups aside from his membership in the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions in 1946. This organization was cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities as a communist front and included a number of other prominent citizens in its membership. In 1948, Sinatra allegedly took part in an appeal to the voters of Italy to vote against the communist ticket in the elections then being held in that country. Material has appeared in the press linking Sinatra with known hoodlums, and in February, 1947, he was alleged to have spent four days in the company of Lucky Luciano, the deported Italian criminal who was prominent in the narcotics traffic in America. His name has also been prominently linked with Joseph and Rocco Fischetti, members of the Capone gang, Willie Moretti, former underworld boss of Bergen County, New Jersey, James Tarantino, an associate of Benjamin "Bugsey" Siegel, and other hoodlums on the west coast. As recently as 1955,

he was seen frequenting an after-hours bottle club in New York frequented by known hoodlums and is reputedly one of the twelve major stockholders in the Sands Hotel, a gambling establishment in Las Vegas allegedly controlled by Albert "Longie" Zwillman and Joseph Stacher, both notorious gangsters from New Jersey. In February, 1944, the Bureau made limited inquiries concerning his Selective Service status after receiving an anonymous letter alleging he had paid \$40,000 to obtain a deferred classification. Selective Service records reflected that his physical examination indicated that he was suffering from emotional instability. Criminal files of the Identification Division reflect Sinatra was arrested in November, 1938, and charged with seduction. The charge was later changed to adultery when it appeared that the woman in question was married, and the charge was dismissed when no true bill was returned by the grand jury. Sinatra's mother, Mrs. Natalie Sinatra, was arrested in November, 1937, on a charge of abortion. No disposition is given for this case. Lawrence Garaventi, said to be an uncle of Sinatra.

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Bureau files do not verify his relationship to Sinatra. In 1944, columnist Frederick C. Othman, in a syndicated article, quoted Sinatra as saying that he received a letter from the Bureau concerning an applicant in which he was requested to return four autographed photographs for the girls in Mr. Nichols' office. When contacted, Sinatra denied the story but stated that he had received a letter of that kind from the office of the Adjutant General and would have Othman correct the matter. In September, 1950, through an intermediary, Sinatra offered his services to the Bureau, and the Director noted his agreement with Mr. Tolson's comment that we "want nothing to do with him."

DETAILS:

A. PURPOSE:

Based on a letter from Bill Davidson, 440 East 55th Street, New York 2, New York, dated January 20, 1957, you requested a summary of information in Bufiles and other sources concerning captioned individual.

B. BACKGROUND:

Francis Albert Sinatra, aka Frank Sinatra, was born December 12, 1915 or 1916, at Hoboken, New Jersey, the son of Martin Sinatra, a former professional boxer, and Natalie "Dolly" Sinatra, both of whom were allegedly born in Italy. He left high school in 1935 to work for the "Jersey Observer," a newspaper published in Hoboken, and during that year began his singing career in night clubs and roadhouses in the northern New Jersey area. He was married on February 4, 1939, to Nancy Barbato at Jersey City, New Jersey, and is the father of three children, Nancy, age 15, Frankie, age 11, and Christina, age 7. He was granted a divorce by his wife in 1951 and married actress Ava Gardner on November 7, 1951. He was separated from her after approximately two years of marriage. (Time Magazine, August 29, 1955, pages 52-59, and 62-83219-17)

C. BUREAU RELATIONS WITH SINATRA:

(1) Frederick C. Othman incident, February 9, 1944. On February 9, 1944, in a syndicated article, columnist Othman quoted Sinatra as saying he had received a letter from the Bureau concerning an applicant, in which he was requested to return four autographed photographs for the girls in Mr. Nichols' office. Upon interview, Othman claimed to have received the story from Sinatra years before when he was covering the Department of Justice. When contacted in this regard, Sinatra stated that the letter had come from the Adjutant General and that he had so informed Othman. He stated that he would have Othman correct this matter. (62-83219-17)

(2) Gary, Indiana, High School student strike, November 1, 1945. In October, 1945, the students of Froebel High School in Gary, Indiana, refused to attend their classes because of the large number of Negro students enrolled at the school. Frank Sinatra made a personal appeal to the students at an assembly held at the school to end the strike. During the course of this appeal, he launched a personal attack against two prominent citizens of Gary, Indiana, whom he

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attempted to connect with the strike incident. As a result of his attack, a local Catholic priest left the stage and protested to Sinatra's manager, one George Evans. Evans replied that Sinatra's information came, in part at least, from the confidential files of the FBI. (62-83219-17)

(3) OFFER OF SERVICE TO THE BUREAU, SEPTEMBER 7, 1950:

b7c On September 7, 1950, [redacted] contacted the Director's office and was referred to Mr. J. P. Mohr to whom he relayed an offer by Frank Sinatra to be of service to the FBI. According to [redacted] Sinatra felt that as a result of the publicity which he had received connecting him with subversive elements, he might be able to be of service in some capacity and had first considered contacting CIA. According to [redacted] at the advice of a CIA representative, he was told to contact the FBI. He also stated that Sinatra denied any subversive affiliations. The Director noted his agreement with Mr. Tolson's comment that we "want nothing to do with him." (62-83219-17)

D. ALLEGED SUBVERSIVE AFFILIATIONS:

b7d On December 14, 1954, the State Department requested a name check on Sinatra, and a summary memorandum dated December 30, 1954, was prepared setting forth his alleged contacts with the Communist Party and numerous cited communist front groups. It was reported that a confidential and reliable informant in December, 1945, advised that [redacted]

[redacted] that Frank Sinatra, the well-known radio and movie star, was then a member of the Communist Party. The informant stated he was told that Sinatra formerly held membership in the American Youth for Democracy Organization in New Jersey but had recently been admitted to the New York branch of the Communist Party. *qu*

b7c In view of a sworn affidavit, executed by Sinatra on January 10, 1955, in connection with his application for a passport, that he had never been a member of the Communist Party or of any organization of a subversive character the State Department requested an investigation by the Bureau to determine whether prosecution was warranted against Sinatra for making a false statement in the application. By memorandum of March 7, 1955, the Department instructed the Bureau to conduct the necessary investigation. This investigation was closed on November 4, 1955, with a report of SA [redacted] of the Los Angeles

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Office bearing the character "SECURITY MATTER - C; FRAUD AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT." The investigation developed no evidence connecting Sinatra with the Communist Party or the communist movement aside from his membership in the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions in 1946. This organization was described by the California Committee on Un-American Activities as a communist front. The February 13, 1946, issue of "The Independent," published by the Independent Citizens Committee of Arts, Sciences, and Professions, listed Frank Sinatra among ten names under the heading "Vice Chairmen." This publication also listed in this capacity such individuals as Joseph E. Davies, Fiorello H. LaGuardia, Archibald MacLeish and Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer. Included in the list of some thirty members of the Board of Directors appeared the name of James Roosevelt. (100-417728-20, 18)

It was also noted in above-mentioned report that in April, 1948, the "New York Daily Mirror" contained an article captioned "Sinatra to Stage Radio Plea to Italy for Defeat of Reds," carrying the name Louella Parsons in the by-line. The item read in part as follows: "An appeal broadcast directly to the Italian people to vote against the communist ticket in the April 18, 1948, election is being arranged for by Frank Sinatra..." The article went on to state "Sinatra, who returned from New York today, was asked by Washington officials to get together a show with famous guests of Italian parentage, and Frankie gladly accepted the assignment to help fight communism. Twenty-seven recordings will be made and played in various parts of Italy in an effort to reach even the most remote part of that troubled nation." (100-417728-18)

E. ALLEGED ASSOCIATION WITH KNOWN CRIMINALS AND HOODLUMS:

The column of Robert C. Ruark, "Washington News," Washington, D. C., issue of February 20, 1947, reported that Frank Sinatra had been in Havana, Cuba, for four days during the previous week and that "his companion in public and in private was Luciano, Luciano's bodyguard and a rich collection of gamblers and high-binders." The article indicated that Luciano and Sinatra were seen together at the race tracks, the gambling casino and at special parties. (39-2141A; 62-83219-10)

The column of Westbrook Pegler, "As Pegler Sees It," in the "New York Journal American," issue of September 10, 1947, carried a caption "Publicity Would Re-Shine Sinatra's Reputation." It is set forth in this article

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that a campaign of propaganda has been running in the press, the magazines and on the radio to rehabilitate Frank Sinatra, whose reputation was impaired "last winter" when Sinatra was observed associating with notorious persons in Cuba including Charles "Lucky" Luciano "the deported Italian criminal who had served part of a long term in New York for prostituting women" and who "is a gangster in the Al Capone tradition and is associated with the narcotics trade as well as with prostitution." (62-83219-A, "New York Journal American," issue of 9/10/47)

The column of Westbrook Pegler in the "Times Herald," Washington, D. C., issue of September 11, 1947, sets forth that when Frank Sinatra flew to Havana, Cuba, on February 11, 1947, he was accompanied by Joe and Rocco Fischetti. According to the article "the Fischetti's are related to the Capones and have many interests in common with the Capone gang." (62-83219-A, "Washington Times Herald" 9/11/47)

Westbrook Pegler in his column which was printed in the "New York Journal American," issue of September 12, 1947, which was captioned "Tells of Parasite Hoodlums of Hollywood," sets forth that Willie Moretti, alias Willie Moore, underworld boss of Bergen County, New Jersey, was a friend of Frank Sinatra. The article stated that "it was in Bergen County that Sinatra was arrested in 1938 on a charge of seduction and causing the pregnancy of an unmarried young woman. Sinatra was in the roadhouse stage of his career and Moretti or Moore was his friend of some years. The complaining witness developed a husband in about one month so that the charge was reduced to adultery which naturally was beneath the notice of the worldly Bergen County Grand Jury. No indictment was found and Sinatra was discharged."

Westbrook Pegler in his column in the "Times Herald," issue of October 4, 1947, set forth that James Tarantino, editor and publisher of the magazine "Hollywood Nite Life," Hollywood, California, was a friend and protege of Frank Sinatra. Pegler described Tarantino as "a swipe and hustler who used to hang around Jacobs Beach, a stretch near Madison Square Garden where the fighters, managers and racketeers gather."

Pegler stated in the above article that George Evans, Sinatra's press agent and manager had denied that Sinatra had anything to do with Tarantino. In contradiction to this Pegler reported that on February 4, 1946, Frank Sinatra's name was signed first as a member of a "Citizens Committee" in a telegram to the prosecuting attorney of Los Angeles County, California, demanding police protection for Tarantino and his wife and child who had been "threatened and

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harassed by political gangsters." Pegler also reported that Sinatra had caused the meeting of the "Citizens Committee."

It was reliably reported that Tarantino specialized in sensationalism and took orders from Michael "Mickey" Cohen, the well-known Los Angeles, California, gangster, and that he was friendly with the late notorious gangster "Bugsy" Siegel.

b7c [REDACTED] Bureau of Narcotics, U. S. Treasury Department, who is assigned to the office of Assistant U. S. Attorney Robert L. Patterson, Southern District of New York, made available on March 7, 1956, a memorandum prepared by him dated November 15, 1955, which relates that Frank Sinatra visits the Gold Key Club regularly while in New York. The club is described as an after-hours bottle club frequented by known hoodlums, and [REDACTED] commented that Sinatra appears to prefer the company of these hoodlums and that their admiration for him appears to be mutual. According to [REDACTED] during the winter of 1955, one Vincent Mauro gave an elaborate party for Sinatra at the Gold Key Club on the occasion of the latter's departure for a personal appearance tour in Australia. It was alleged that as a favor to Mauro, Sinatra had appeared at the Ciro Club in Florida for a salary far below that usually received by him in night club appearances, for the purpose of attempting to pull that establishment out of the hole. Mauro was described as a lieutenant of Anthony Strollo, who, according to [REDACTED] is an underworld big shot who has a controlling interest in many Greenwich Village night clubs and several others located in the Broadway area. (62-81783-16)

The records of the Clark County, Nevada, Sheriff's Office at Las Vegas as of July 25, 1955, list Frank Sinatra as one of the twelve major stockholders in the Sands Hotel, a gambling establishment in Las Vegas. According to information developed by the Salt Lake City Office, many of the stockholders of record in this particular operation are actually working for notorious gamblers and racketeers. Included among the more prominent of the latter are Albert "Longie" Zwillman and Joseph Stacher, was. "Doc" Harris, both notorious gangsters from New Jersey. (63-2712-9)

F. ALLEGATIONS CONCERNING SELECTIVE SERVICE STATUTE:

In February, 1944, limited inquiries were made by this Bureau concerning Frank Sinatra's Selective Service Status. This action was predicated upon a statement in an anonymous letter alleging that Sinatra paid \$40,000 to obtain a 4F classification. Inquiry revealed that Sinatra was suffering from an ear ailment and that his rejection was in conformance with the then existing

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Selective Service regulations. The physician who examined Sinatra for the Selective Service Board also made a notation on his physical examination report that Sinatra was suffering from emotional instability. (25-244122)

G. SPECIFIC INQUIRIES MADE BY DAVIDSON

In his letter, Davidson stated that he planned on doing a definitive, three-part profile on Sinatra for "Look" magazine and was concerned about several items which he had come across since the manner in which they were resolved would help him in "pitching" his article. In this regard, it may be noted that the August 29, 1955, issue of "Time" magazine did a rather "definitive" cover story on Sinatra, and his life has been the subject of a book published in 1946 by Harper and Brothers, New York. This book was entitled "The Voice" and was written by E. J. Kahn, Jr. (100-417728-18) Davidson asked for verification of the following:

1. That Sinatra was arrested for rape in Jersey City or Hoboken around 1934. The charge is supposed to have been reduced to seduction and then thrown out by the Grand Jury. (Westbrook Pegler has reported this several times in his columns.)

COMMENT: The records of the clerk of the Second Criminal Judicial District of the county of Bergen, Hackensack, New Jersey, reveal the following information: Docket 15228 in the State vs. Frank Sinatra reflects that Sinatra was charged on November 26, 1938, ... by [REDACTED] New Jersey, as follows: "On the second and ninth days of November, 1938, under the promise of marriage, he (Sinatra) did then and there have sexual intercourse with the said complaintant who was then and there a single female of good repute...." The Charles Castity Company, 214 Maine Street, Hackensack, New Jersey, made Sinatra's bond of \$1500 on December 7, 1938. The complaint was withdrawn when it was ascertained that the complaintant was in fact married. Docket 15307 in the case of the State vs. Frank Sinatra, ^{INDICATES} a complaint was filed on December 21, 1938, by [REDACTED] New Jersey, charging Sinatra with adultery in that he "...on the second and ninth days of November, 1938, committed adultery with the said complaintant, a married woman and wife of [REDACTED]" Sinatra paid his own bond of \$500 on January 4, 1939, and the case was remanded to the jury by order of Judge McIntyre.

Docket 18540, for the Prosecutor of Bills, Bergen County, reveals that no bill was returned on January 17, 1939, by the grand jury, and the complaint charging adultery was dismissed in open court for quarter sessions on January 24, 1939. (62-83219-10)

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The records of the Identification Division under FBI #3794610 contain a fingerprint card submitted by the sheriff's office of Bergen County, Hackensack, New Jersey, indicating arrest of Frank Sinatra on November 26, 1938, on a charge of seduction. His address was given as 841 Garden Street, Hoboken, New Jersey, Pegler's reference to this incident is set out above under "Alleged Association With Known Criminals and Hoodlums."

2. That Sinatra was arrested and convicted of assault around the same time (presumably the 1930's).

COMMENT: There is no information in Bufiles or the records of the Identification Division to substantiate such an arrest. News articles, however, reflect that Sinatra was arrested on April 9, 1947, in Hollywood on a battery warrant based upon a complaint by Lee Mortimer, New York columnist. Sinatra entered a plea of not guilty and was released on a \$500 bail. No disposition of this case appears in the file. (62-83219-17)

3. That Mrs. Natalie Sinatra, his mother, was arrested 6 or 7 times for operating an abortion mill in Hoboken between the years 1930 and 1950 and that she might have been convicted once.

COMMENT: "Time" magazine, mentioned above, a copy of which is attached, reported that Sinatra's mother, known generally as Dolly Sinatra, started out as a practical nurse and helped her husband run a little barroom at the corner of Jefferson and Fourth in Hoboken. She allegedly was active in Democratic ward politics and acted as a midwife at a number of neighborhood births. According to the article, she was a "power" in her part of town, and in 1909 was made a district leader. In 1926, the Mayor of Hoboken appointed her husband to a captaincy in the fire department. The records of the Identification Division contain a single card reflecting a criminal arrest on November 15, 1937, of Mrs. Natalie Sinatra, with alias Dolly Sinatra, on a charge of abortion. Her residence was given as 841 Garden Street, Hoboken, New Jersey, and the card was received from the Hoboken, New Jersey, Police Department. No disposition of the case is given, and the incident is not mentioned in Bufiles. A review of material in Bufiles identifiable with Mrs. Sinatra reflects that [REDACTED] had invented a kidnaping hoax but admitted her story was fictitious after being interviewed by FBI Agents and the New York police. (7-7858)

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
