Considerable investigation has been conducted by the Los Angeles Office and other Bureau offices in connection with the instructions outlined in referenced letter. A review and analysis of the results of the investigation fails to develop any positive evidence connecting SINATRA with the Communist Party or the Communist Party movement.

In view of the foregoing, it is believed that the submission of a regular investigative report setting forth the results of the many interviews undertaken would be preferable to the preparation of a prosecutive summary due to the absence of the calibre of information which should logically be incorporated in a prosecutive summary report.

It is noted that the miscellaneous information furnished by informants in years past, and which was summarized by the Bureau in memorandum form dated 9/30/54, is essentially hearsay, most of which even if true, would have little probative value. The two most significant allegations contained in the summary are those set forth on Page 6, Paragraph 2, and Page 11, Paragraph 1. Reinvestigation of these two items brought forth the following results:

(1) Miami air-tel to the Bureau 9/13/55 sets forth the results of the interview with [redacted] informant who had reported in 1945 having heard CP leaders refer to FRANK SINATRA as a CP member and a former member of the American Youth for Democracy. On reinterview by the Miami Office, [redacted] reported that the information which he had previously reported was of a hearsay nature, having come

[REDACTED] was reinterviewed 4/13/55 by the Albany Office and confirmed his original information. Albany also interviewed [REDACTED] on 4/13/55. [REDACTED] never to have heard anything connecting FRANK SINATRA with the Communist Party or the Young Communist League. The Albany Office also reported two informants as relating that it was common practice of the Communist Party to use prominent names for their causes and to attribute to such individuals Communist Party membership. Several former Communist Party members in Hollywood, who have furnished reliable information in the past and who normally would have been in a position to know if SINATRA were connected with the Communist Party or the Communist Party movement, advised that they had no information that SINATRA was a member of the CP nor did they ever hear him referred to as such in Party circles or as being connected with the Communist movement.

Because of the foregoing, the Los Angeles Office contemplates the submission of a regular investigative report in this matter unless instructed by the Bureau to the contrary. Such report will be prepared and submitted to reach the Bureau within thirty days.

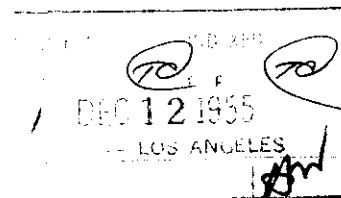

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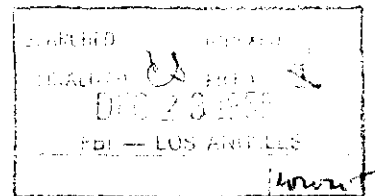

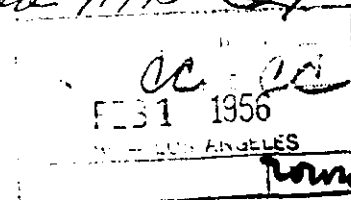

Sinatra Blames BMI Tunes for Career Dip

New York, Sept. 20. — Frank Sinatra charged today that his recording career at Columbia "quickly went into a decline" when the label's A&R chief Mitch Miller began giving him "inferior" material all of which "curiously bearing the BMI label." Charges were made in a telegram to the House Judiciary Committee Anti-Trust Sub-Division investigating tv.

Miller promptly retorted that ~~95%~~ Sinatra's material at Columbia under Miller's aegis had been ASCAP. He added, "It's a hell of a way to run a hearing when they accept telegrams as evidence."

Singer's telegram from Las Vegas asked for anti-trust action to abolish "practices which create restraint and take from the artist those creative freedoms which are so necessary to his talent."

Sinatra contended that before Miller became pop A&R chief at Columbia he enjoyed a free selection of material which "I may modestly say resulted in a modicum of success for me. Before Mr. Miller's advent I had a successful recording career which quickly went into a decline. Rather than continue a frustrating battle, I chose to take my talents elsewhere. It is now a matter of record that since I have associated myself with Capitol Records, a company free of broadcasting affiliations, my career is again financially, creatively and artistically healthy."

Miller said Sinatra owed Columbia \$110,000 when he departed in 1952, the coin representing money advanced to pay back taxes and, presumably, advances against unrealized royalties. Firm now is earning this back, he added, on the re-issuance of old Sinatra sides.

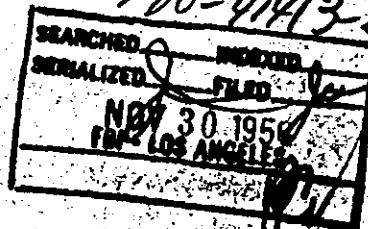

Frank Sinatra is expanding his Essex Productions corporate entity to the status of a full-fledged independent record company and is beginning to make talent deals to build up a talent stable. Essex made its bow in the disk field as the producer of the "High Society" soundtrack album, which was released by Capitol.

Sinatra is nominally a Capitol artist. However, his disk contract, it was learned, is actually held by Essex which will produce all future Sinatra efforts for Capitol.

The setup thus gives the performer a capital gains status on his diskings, with the corporation thus reaping the royalty instead of it going to Sinatra as personal income.

Outfit has been tentatively set to cut some single releases within the next fortnight, the indication being that a firm contract will have been signed by that time.

Meanwhile, Essex apparently has the inside track for another Sinatra soundtrack album, the material that will evolve from his current starrer, "The Joker is Wild," at Paramount. Sinatra is portraying Joe E. Lewis in the biopic, being made by another Sinatra corporation, Bristol.

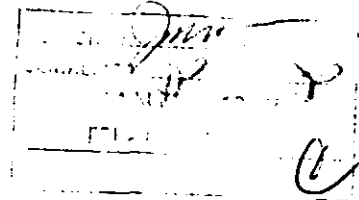

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Reason For Sinatra's TV Vitality: Can Get Residuals Faster Than % Coin From Pix

Frank Sinatra, who tees off his own telefilm series on ABC-TV Oct. 18, disclosed yesterday that his principal reason for entering the weekly tv sweepstakes was the residuals involved—"so that I can set aside a trust fund for my three children and Nancy." The latter is the former Mrs. Sinatra.

Star, currently working in "Pal Joey" at Columbia, said "For years I've been looking to get into a position to set up a trust fund for them, and this is the one way I can do it. It takes longer to get your money back from pictures in which you have a participation." Sinatra has a 25% piece of "Joey,"

as does director George Sidney. He owns 65% of "Johnny Concho," his United Artists film which cost \$364,000 and has grossed around \$1,500,000 to date, he revealed.

Sinatra said he didn't fear the possibility of over-exposure via a tv series. "I can't believe, that if you do a good job—assuming the pictures I've done have been successes—that doing tv on top of that and giving the viewers a show of calibre will hurt me. If I did one running character, I'd be killed. But we have a change of pace, and we're going to hang our hat on versatility. We're not going to try to fool the audience; we will give honest performances.

"There's been talk I make too many records, but they sell. And everytime we put out an album, each one is an entirely different kind. I'll go from swing to ballads, and so on. I think the same thing will hold true in tv. I will be in 13 musical half-hours and 13 dramatic shows, and will host 10 dramatic shows. In addition, I will star in two spectaculars," he said.

Sinatra's \$3,000,000 deal with ABC-TV is a record budget for any half-hour series, even allowing for the fact that figure includes the two spec.

Sinatra said he hopes to shoot his 13 musical shows in a total of 18 days, or 20 at the outside. "It can be done. Our theory is it's like a live tv show. We will rehearse fully, and then shoot. And we plan to work from noon until 8 p.m. I think we can do a better job that way. We've been following that practice on "Pal Joey," and will come in two weeks ahead of schedule," he added.

Sinatra's first tv chores for ABC-TV will be a spec aired Oct. 18 from Hollywood. Bob Hope has been set, and he is negotiating for Kim Novak, from the "Joey" film, and Dinah Shore to do a satirical version of "Joey." He will also utilize the spec to plug his series, which tees off the following week.

For his musical shows, Sinatra is negotiating for Peggy Lee, Patti Page, Sammy Davis, Jr., Dan Dailey, Artur Rubinstein, Bing Crosby, Phil Harris, Nat ("King") Cole. Sinatra's children, Frank, Nancy and Tina, will appear in two or three musical shows individually as performers, he added.

Sinatra will direct at least a couple of the dramatic shows. "I intend to go in that direction in movies, too," he added.

He plans to negotiate with American Tobacco Co. for the services of Jack Benny to appear on

his Feb. 14 spec, since there's a matter of conflicting sponsors involved, Sinatra being bankrolled by Chesterfield and Benny by Lucky Strike. "I hope to break down that age-old barrier of sponsor conflict," he said.

In addition, he is negotiating with Orson Welles for one of the dramatic shows. Sinatra said he would like to use names in half of the 10 dramatic episodes, and good but not star actors in the others. "There are some good actors like Bob Strauss and Arnold Stang, who have never had a star chance. I would like to star them in shows, and just play a bit—one or two minutes—myself in those particular episodes. For example, I saw Jackie Coogan as the cook in "Forbidden Area" on Playhouse '90. I thought he was just great, and we were looking for somebody to play Swifty Morgan in "The Joker Is Wild." I called the studio and suggested Coogan for the part, and they signed him," he said.

William Self is producer of Sinatra's vidpix series, which goes into production July 8 at the Goldwyn Studios, with the 13 musicals first on the agenda. They will then start on the dramatics, but Sinatra will have to leave early in fall for France and his next starring, "Kings Go Forth," in which he is partnered with Frank Ross. Upon his return, he will complete the vidpix. "By Morrow has been signed to write the musicals, and Jack Donaghy, a director, Nelson Riddle is conductor-arranger for the musicals." Sinatra's deal with ABC-TV calls for a 60-40 split on residuals, with the star receiving the bigger chunk.

It is very comforting to know that through your efforts the U. S. Senate is taking action to prevent broadcasters from plugging the songs they own and burying the songs they don't own."

Sinatra then charged that Mitch Miller "had admitted under oath

Sinatra Drops Look Mag Libel Suit, New Case To Test Right To Privacy

Frank Sinatra will attempt to clarify rights to privacy of personalities in the public eye, he stated yesterday in dismissing his \$2,300,000 libel suit against Look mag in Federal Court. In joint agreement with Look, he then filed a test suit in Superior Court here for invasion of privacy.

New action, which doesn't specify damages beyond the statutory \$3,000 minimum, will assume that the Look articles published earlier this year about Sinatra were printed in good faith. However, suit will attempt to determine right of the press to "delve into, and disclose, the personal or private—as dis-

tinguished from the professional and public—aspects of an entertainer's life," according to joint statement issued by Sinatra and Look reps.

In joint statement, Sinatra continued that he didn't deny the right to discuss or criticize his professional activities, but unless the privacy issue was settled, a "public figure" was "a second-class citizen, in that he is denied rights which others enjoy." He's bringing the Superior Court suit specifically to settle these issues, since he understands the courts have never really established such rights to privacy, he commented.

Further, test case involving Look would be a good one because the mag is of "recognized standing—not an expose or scandal-type publication—and the decision will be by the courts of California, where so many entertainment personalities and a large segment of the entertainment industry is headquartered."

Speaking for Look, v.p. John F. Harding hoped that the case might settle the issue for all communication media. Mag's position is that "any entertainment personality who manifests a desire for publicity as to his professional and public activities and affairs cannot simply turn on publicity as he wants, or needs it, and turn it off at other times, or sift and strain it as he wishes," according to the statement. The press has the right

to publish facts as to all public figures . . . "not simply as professional performers, but also persons."

Meanwhile, Sinatra and Look have cancelled their agreement, under which the singer-actor was to have written a by-lined autobiog for publication in the mag.

Capra Production Packs Plenty of B.O. Appeal; Well-Acted

You need "A Hole in the Head" whether you are a ticket-buyer or an exhibitor. It's a double guarantee to surefire entertainment. First, there is Frank Sinatra, whom youthful audiences will find as modern as hi-fi and as pungent as a cup of espresso. Then, there is Frank Capra, the first director whose name, following the advent of talkies, attained a marquee value equal or greater than that of any star. Beginning with his sensational "It Happened One Night," Capra never made a flop. Up until his temporary retirement about eight years ago, he created a succession of the finest comedy dramas in the history of show business. Now he is back with all his past techniques in full blossom and with a wonderfully new ability to capture the flavor of our times. The result is a full-bodied comedy that registers its success not in chuckles but in roars.

Arnold Schulman's screenplay successfully expands his stage play until it contains all the ingredients for a Capra hit. These are so time-tested that it's a wonder other directors haven't latched onto them during Capra's absence. First of all (as in his "Lady For a Day") there is a solid emotional basis that gives one something to pull for. And this appeal expresses itself in conflict. Sinatra is a good natured, irresponsible visionary whose urge to fly off beyond the horizon is constantly at war with his devotion to his motherless son. Though he calls the kid a "nag" there is really a joyous companionship between them. The boy is played by Eddie Hodges, who scored a hit in the stage production of "The Music Man," and he's a real screen find, who will remind one of such previous youthful naturals as Jackie Cooper and Shirley Temple. He gets over a strange know- ingness regarding his pop's desires to grab a fast buck and to make time with the dames. Sinatra, never playing down to the boy, establishes a very believable and lovable relationship with the kid that no audience will want to see destroyed.

But it constantly is threatened. Sinatra's only possession is a mortgaged,

down - at - heel Florida hotel. Despite the fact that he's on the verge of losing it, he dreams of getting in the chips by promoting an east coast Disneyland. One of the facets of Capra's genius is his ability to give a change of pace to a straight-line story by developing a whole series of well-rounded and fully developed incidental characters. In this case, there is a marvelous beatnik (played with weird fascination by Carolyn Jones) who's constantly making ineffectual attempts to have Sinatra run away with her. Then there is Sinatra's hard-working and completely "square" brother, Edward G. Robinson, whom Sinatra, by devious schemes, tries to put the bite on. If this picture, in which all parts are played to perfection, has any standouts, they are delivered by the penny-pinching Robinson and his sentimental wife (Thelma Ritter). Little Caesar has become a great comedian. Confident of their abilities to sustain each other, Capra gives Robinson and Ritter long scenes together, without breaking his camera setup and the laughs come so thick and fast one is bound to miss some of the dialogue. There's a marvelous running gag (a typical Capra invention) built around a platform rocking chair that knocks Robinson on the head every time he sits in it.

Robinson's solution for all ills is to get Sinatra married off to somebody with money. Thelma knows a wealthy widow. As played by that stunning head, Eleanor Parker, she turns out to be quite a dish, and gives a brilliant performance. Her encounter with Sinatra occurs in a daintily furnished apartment, so crowded with feminine furbelows that the characters are obliged to move crabwise whenever they pass each other. With every touch affecting them, they play a torturous love scene without an embrace. Miss Parker gives a touching portrayal of a passionate but decent woman yearning to replace the husband and son she lost in a recent accident. Some quibbling quality: In Sinatra makes him recognize the "isn't a broad." So he tells the whole marriage for money plot and de- parts, breaking her heart.

Putting up a false front, Sinatra crashes the party of a crass and boi-

terous old buddy (Keenan Wynn) who along with his body guards and dream-boat blonde secretary (Joi Lansing) has come south to play the big show at the dog races. Here Capra recaptures the mood of frenetic spectacular upsur, with tragic undertones, that he created so ably in "Broadway Bill." Having lost his last nickel, Sinatra deliberately tries to alienate the love of his son so that he will go away with Robinson. There is a happy but topsy-turvy ending in which Sinatra isn't reformed but Robinson is. He decides to stop selling garter belts to become a bum too. You feel that he has enough dough to support them all in a crazy happy sort of vagabondage.

This is a warm, human and thoroughly entertaining comedy in which Sinatra casually works in a couple of good songs, "All My Tomorrows" and "High Hopes" (both by Sammy Cahn and Jimmy Van Heusen). Like the talented and self-assured star that he is, Sinatra allows even minor members of the supporting cast to have big moments. These include Jimmy Komack, as Robinson's amiably stupid son, Dub Taylor as a boll weevil don't-give-a-damn Southern desk clerk, and Connie Sawyer who gives the production two hilarious punctuations as a loop-legged drunk.

Photography, in CinemaScope and De Luxe Color, by William H. Daniels records the glamour of tropical nights and the detail of sun-drenched days on the beach with perfection. This is a film that should spell big business. — Jack Moffitt

TRUMBO'S attorney for the corporation is AUBREY FINN. When he is cleared for return to WGA, w membership, TRUMBO will file about 30 pseudonyms or pen names he has used as his writing names. His most recent was the name SAM JACKSON which he used in doing the script for "Spartacus" which he wrote for Bryna Productions (a KIRK DOUGLAS producing company).

Credits for "Spartacus" may be held up until it is decided whether the company will give the writing credits ~~xxx~~ openly to TRUMBO or to his pseudonym SAM JACKSON.

Although he will reveal his pen names and his contracts in past years while he was out of the Guild, TRUMBO is hesitant about revealing the names of people who helped him out during the lean years with writing assignments when he was "blacklisted".

In regard to the ALBERT MALTZ-FRANK SINATRA deal which hit the press this date, TRUMBO [REDACTED] that in his opinion, it was a bad thing politically. SINATRA was asked to hold off confirming the deal by Senator JOHN KENNEDY who is the brother-in-law of PETER LANFORD, producing partner of FRANK SINATRA in the venture. KENNEDY felt it would be bad publicity for him prior to the primaries in the state of New Hampshire. Following KENNEDY'S success in that primary, however, together with the apology the Republicans made to KENNEDY following the charge by some N.H. official that KENNEDY "was soft on Communists", the KENNEDY interests felt it would not hurt to go ahead and release the news of the SINATRA-MALTZ deal.

According to TRUMBO, MALTZ is currently at the [REDACTED] Arbison-Flaza, NYC just prior to ~~xxx~~ going to Europe.

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On 3-22-60, FRANK SINATRA'S producing company, ESSEX PRODUCTIONS, announced that ALBERT MALTZ would write the screenplay for "Execution of Private Slovik". This property has been offered around the industry for some years but rejected as unsuitable for export as Un-American, etc. [REDACTED] info is that the Defense Department has refused to cooperate or give its facilities because of the subject matter. [REDACTED] says that probably SINATRA himself will direct but not appear in the picture.

SINATRA and MALTZ are not strangers, according to [REDACTED] MALTZ wrote "The World We Live In" for SINATRA around 1946 which was a United Nations project. Film and TV star PETER LAWFORD is reported to be SINATRA'S partner and the brother-in-law of ~~U.S. Senator [REDACTED]~~ presidential aspirant.

DALTON TRUMBO uses what is called a personal services corporation (a Calif. Corporation) as a front for his writing activities. His under-the-table writing deals in past years have been made by employing this company so that his own name never has appeared on pictures for which he has written the scripts. Apparently the only "asset" of the corporation is TRUMBO. TRUMBO'S attorney is AUBREY FINN.

TRUMBO has applied for reinstatement to membership in WGA, w, and will probably make it.

Source [redacted] talk of various cameramen and other technicians who were at the Las Vegas location that while the company was there Senator JOHN KENNEDY visited the location and was in frequent contact with various members of the company including Negro star SAMMY DAVIS, JR., who furnished his personal automobile for the senator's use. DAVIS's personal colored chauffeur was assigned exclusively to the job of taking Senator KENNEDY wherever he wanted to go.

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The following is strictly speculation of various people around Warner Bros.: Senator KENNEDY is not cognizant of the way Hollywood people operate. SINATRA does not have enough brains himself to know whether ALBERT MALTZ is a good, bad or indifferent writer. It is speculated that someone, possibly [redacted] (Bufile 100-56069), who was in the past at least very close to the CP, may have influenced SINATRA to tie up with ALBERT MALTZ; that someone is or may be trying to promote SINATRA, SAMMY DAVIS, JR., and their crowd as "fair-haired boys" known to Senator KENNEDY in case the senator gets to the White House.

~~BUT YOU CAN~~ argue against Sinatra's incredible action this time. Screenwriter Maltz, whom Frank hired, no doubt is an oppressed individual in Sinatra's estimation. This man has every right to be oppressed. In the talent department, he is no Sammy Davis. He is no Sammy Davis, either, when it comes to staunch Americanism. The best thing that can happen to Maltz is to send him to his beloved Russia.

Most of all, I'd like to see Sinatra back down for once. Unfortunately, as mentioned before, I don't think he knows how. Here is a little story about Frank. It tends to show what I mean.

A few years ago Dorothy Gray (Mrs. Harry Joe Brown) gave a party at Donald Duncan's home in Palm Springs. Sinatra and our mutual friend, Jimmy Van Heusen, already were there when I arrived. One of the guests insulted Frank, or at least, Frank considered himself insulted. I didn't hear what was said. The guest was quite a prominent man—and a pretty husky one, too, illustrating that Sinatra wasn't picking a push-over. Sinatra bated the man so hard he was taken to a hospital. The injured guest was furious. He threatened all kinds of lawsuits and it looked as though Frank was in for a lot of unhappy publicity. Sinatra's career wasn't doing too well at the time. He couldn't afford notoriety.

I tried to placate the victim—which wasn't easy. He didn't like me, either—and I guess that went vice versa. Finally, I told him I'd get Frank to apologize if he'd let everything drop. I went to Frank's Palm Springs home that night, but he wouldn't budge. I went over again the next morning and Sinatra decided it would be better to get things settled amicably.

I drove him over to see his spar-mate of the night before. "All you have to say is 'I'm sorry,' and shake hands," I told Sinatra. I told him he didn't have to mean it—to just say it. Frank agreed.

BUT ONCE Frank saw the fellow, he lost his courage. He couldn't force himself to say "I'm sorry." The thought of it rebelled in his mind. So Frank blurted out a gruff "hello" and held out his hand. He still couldn't stand to apologize, no matter what it might have cost him—career, money or anything.

Inasmuch as I have yet to meet the perfect human being, I don't censure him, for I know him. And I know too, that what he has done hurts him deep inside and causes his mind to churn when he goes to bed at night. Regardless, Frank can't stand to holler "uncle" . . . more appropriately in this case, "Uncle Sam," who is hurting, too.

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[REDACTED] the circumstances of MALTZ's departure from the Guild may be a considerable stumbling block to the favorable consideration of his application for reinstatement if and when he formally makes it.

[REDACTED] however, are of the opinion that the TRUMBO reinstatement will set a precedent for the readmission into the Guild of such writers as PAUL JARRICO (Bufile 100-233250); [REDACTED] RING LARDNER, JR. (Bufile 100-295885); HONO BUTLER (Bufile 100-321017); and probably others who have defied HCUA on constitutional grounds in past years.

JARRICO and [REDACTED] are currently residing in France. BUTLER resides in Mexico.

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THURNO's reinstatement as a member of WGA, W is now an accomplished fact; however, there is considerable opposition to him, [redacted] the Guild Disciplinary Committee is currently engaged in trying to collect evidence that THURNO may have been in direct violation of a Guild rule which says in part that no Guild member or former member can make or negotiate any deal or contract with a producing company while such company is on the Guild's strike list. The same thing is true of ALBERT MALKE, who has applied for readmission into the Guild.

Although KIRK DOUGLAS' production company, Bryna Productions, and OTTO FRENKELER's company have now signed agreements with the Guild, both companies were on the Guild's strike list for a time. THURNO wrote "Spartacus" for Bryna and is under contract to FRENKELER for "London". ALBERT MALKE was replaced by THURNO to do "London". If the Guild can find evidence that THURNO and/or MALKE did any work at all on either of these productions while the respective companies were on the strike list, then under both the Taft-Hartley Law and the Writers Guild constitution, THURNO and MALKE could be classified as "strikebreakers". TRUSSO could be characterized as a "fink", that is, a union member or former union member who engages in strike breaking activity. In such a case, TRUSSO could be ousted from Guild membership for life, and MALFE could not become a Guild member. Head of the Guild Disciplinary Committee is writer SAM MERRIN who is very anti-TRUSSO and MALFE.

On March 30, 1960, ALBERT MALFE applied by cable from abroad for reinstatement to Guild membership, stating he had no desire to be a strike breaker, and that his deal with FRANK SINATRA was contingent upon SINATRA's company signing with the Writers Guild. As of this date, SINATRA has not signed with the Guild and his is one of the few remaining independent producing companies who are still holding out from negotiating with the Guild for a new contract.

MALFE' application to the Guild has not been made public yet. It may be that the Guild may go through the formality of accepting MALFE and then expel him for strike breaking if it should appear they can prove such activity.

As of March 30, 1960, ALBERT MALFE was at the King George Hotel in Athens, but according to TRUSSO, is en route to Israel where either MALFE or his wife, MARGARET, is gathering data for a book on that country.

TRUSSO has been invited by OTTO PREMINGER to come to Israel where PREMINGER's company is on location making "Exodus"; however, TRUSSO does not contemplate the trip because of the illness of his mother. It is not necessary for TRUSSO to be with the company merely because he is doing the script.

In regard to the 12 pseudonyms used by TRUSSO which he has filed with the Guild, as set out in referenced airtel, March 30, 1960, TRUSSO tells [redacted] that only two of these ever appeared on the screen as credits, namely ROBERT RICH and KATHARINE B. WESTON. The other pseudonyms have been used to cover TRUSSO's identity in his dealings with Springfield Productions, which [redacted] believes was a company set up for that purpose, that is, Springfield Productions "loaned out" TRUSSO's writing services under the various names as noted.

Frank Sinatra is paying off Albert Maltz and simultaneously firing him off the assignment to screenplay "The Execution Of Pvt. Slovik" following the tidal wave of reaction against Sinatra's action in hiring the member of "the Hollywood Ten" who refused to answer whether he was or is a Communist when haled before the House Un-American Activities Committee more than a decade ago.

Sinatra, in a statement issued Friday, said:

After hiring Maltz, Sinatra was denounced in many quarters and subsequently took trade ads on March 28, declaring, among other views, "I am in complete accord with the statement . . . by J. D. Nicola of the Catholic Legion of Decency, who said, 'The Legion evaluates films on the basis of art, not the artists.'"

Last week Nicola observed that Sinatra's "inference was unfair"; that the Legion, while it evaluates pix "on the basis of art, not the artists," nevertheless is very unlikely to approve such a deal as that made with Maltz.

Nicola also noted that as a member of the lay advisory board of the Legion he was not at any time speaking for the policy of the reviewing group on any specific matter such as Sinatra's hiring of Maltz.

[redacted] KIRK DOUGLAS recently announced that [redacted] [redacted] one of the "Hollywood 10," was to receive credit for screen work on a film recently produced by DOUGLAS entitled "Spartacus", production of which is just being completed at Universal Studios in Hollywood. [redacted] stated that it would be interesting to see just what treatment [redacted] had given the screen story, which was taken from the novel by the same name and which had been written by HOWARD FAST.

[redacted] continued that, in his opinion, the film "Spartacus" would undoubtedly contain Communist propaganda by every nature of the subject matter. [redacted] said that he had read the novel "Spartacus" which was sort of a "chopped up story" and concerned a gladiator school in Rome during the days of the Roman Empire and the abasement of the gladiators who had been brought to Rome from all over the world. The gladiators, who were being driven to crucifixion, revolted. The general theme is "all for the revolution," the gladiators were presented as the underdogs and the Roman Empire as the capitalists.

[redacted] pointed out that most Americans are unaware of the implications of the name "Spartacus" but that it is a historical fact that following the end of World War I the Communist movement got under way in Germany under the title of the Spartacus Party and that to this day in Germany and central Europe that the term Spartacus is synonymous with the Communist movement. [redacted] stated that of his own personal knowledge, he knew that this connotation was given to the word Spartacus in Western Germany.

[redacted] he mentioned that the Webster's Dictionary referred to the Spartacus Party as a party organized in Germany in 1918 along extreme socialistic lines.

[redacted] stated that HERBERT LUFT, who writes a movie column for the B'nai B'rith Messenger in Los Angeles, had mentioned the film under production by KIRK DOUGLAS entitled "Spartacus" and had given summary of the significance that this film would have in Europe due to the fact of the political significance which Central Europeans attach to the Spartacus Party. LUFT, according to [redacted] was at one time

confined to a German Jewish concentration camp during World War II and while his article regarding "Spartacus" outlined the "Jewish point of view" it more or less substantiated the opinion expressed by [redacted] regarding the possible political implications of the proposed film Spartacus.

[redacted] had never heard anything derogatory concerning [redacted] either from a moral or loyalty standpoint.

[redacted] said that he was furnishing the above information to the FBI as a matter of general knowledge to indicate the trend in Hollywood of the open acceptance of persons with known Communist backgrounds. He stated that the actors and writers strike currently in effect in the motion picture industry was having quite demoralizing effects on some of the major studios, particularly 20th Century Fox and MGM, on an international basis and they were forced to cut their staffs in England and other foreign offices. He mentioned also that the major motion picture studios will probably never recover, in his opinion, from the strike and would become large rental studios leasing to independent producers. Furthermore, the fact that practically all motion pictures and television productions are now made by many independent producers would make it much easier for Communists, Communist sympathizers or other undesirable persons to infiltrate the industry as there would not be any strong unity against such infiltration as the major motion picture studios have taken together in the past.

Sinatra's 'Inference' Unfair That Legion Of Decency OK's Maltz Deal

New York, April 5. — The Roman Catholic Legion of Decency and Frank Sinatra do not necessarily "stand together," despite all those Sinatra-sponsored trade ads anent the hiring of Albert Maltz. The Legion is more than a little upset by Sinatra's use in his defense of the Maltz deal, of a statement to the effect that the Legion evaluates films on the basis of "the art, not the artist."

J. D. Nicola, assistant editor of Information, Catholic monthly published here by the Paulist Fathers, and author of the original article which contained the much-quoted quote, yesterday issued a press statement "strongly" objecting to

Sinatra's interpretation of his interpretation of the Legion's stand.

"Sinatra has placed my words in new context, from which can be drawn an inference which is unwarranted," said Nicola, "namely: that the Legion of Decency finds nothing improper in his hiring of Maltz."

No Official Spokesman

"By referring to me as 'J. D. Nicola of the Catholic Legion of Decency,' Sinatra creates the erroneous impression I am an official spokesman for the Legion. Rather, I am of Information magazine; a Catholic journalist who happens to be lay member of the Legion's board of consultants. My writings may be accepted as informed, but not official. Sinatra's raising of this journalist's mere observation to the level of official pronouncement could result in some misleading conclusions."

"In his statement, Sinatra cites my explanation of a Legion modus operandi as something with which he is 'in complete accord,' as if the

Legion of Decency and Frank Sinatra were united against those who oppose his hiring of Maltz.

Do Not 'Stand Together'

"This 'we stand together' inference is absurd. Sinatra has attempted to draw a parallel where none exists. His hiring of the blacklisted writer cannot be adequately defended by his espousal of the 'art, not the artist' theory. This is so because Sinatra, as a producer, has a broader responsibility than does the Legion of Decency . . ."

"The motion picture producer must make other considerations. Offering professional Communist — if Maltz is one — an opportunity to work in an influential mass medium is not exactly parallel to offering a known adulteress an opportunity to portray a heroine on screen. The true Communist will make every effort to use the medium for Communistic ends, the more subtly the better . . . Sinatra, in using my statement as he did, has made it possible to infer that the Catholic Legion of Decency is not opposed to Hollywood employment of such political undesirables. Such inference would be unfair . . . The Legion does not oppose the activity of those fighting the Hollywood employment of Communists. It would oppose anyone attempting to infer that it does."

Legion Eyes 'Suspects'

The Legion obviously plans to take a very close look at all films on which "suspect" talent worked. What irritated the Catholic group most about the Sinatra ads was the fact that it implied the Legion had taken a stand on what is a political issue, which is outside its jurisdiction. It may not be unlikely, that if this hiring-of-blacklisted-talent goes much further, some other department of the church might take a stand, firmly opposing practice. This could come on a national level or on diocesan level.

In view of the reaction of my family, my friends and the American public, I have instructed my attorneys to make a settlement with Albert Maltz and to inform him that he will not write the screenplay for "The Execution of Private Slovik."

I had thought the major consideration was whether or not the resulting script would be in the best interests of the United States. Since my conversations with Mr. Maltz had indicated that he had an affirmative, pro-American approach to the story, and since I felt fully capable as producer of enforcing such standards, I have defended my hiring of Mr. Maltz.

But the American public has indicated it feels the morality of hiring Albert Maltz is the more crucial matter, and I will accept this majority opinion.

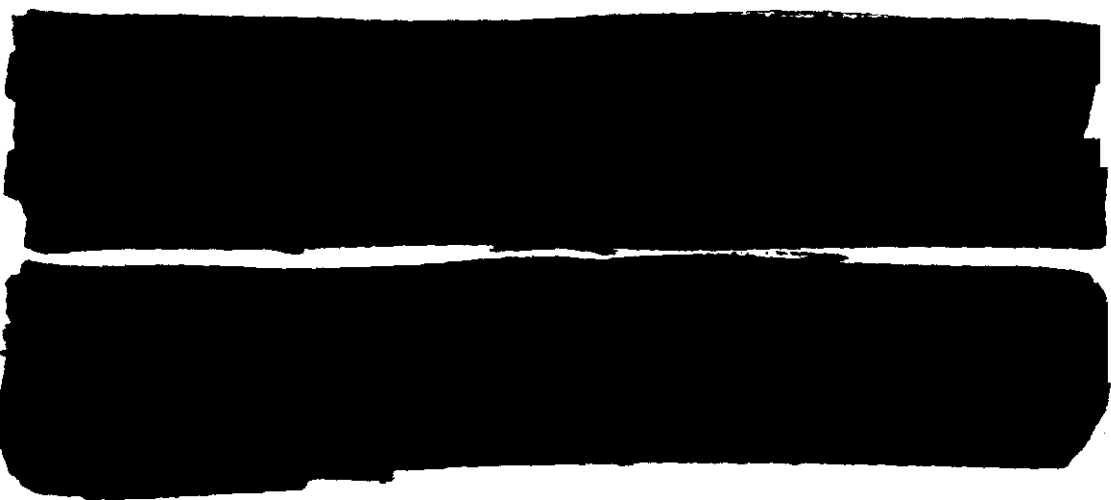
